2024 PHELPS & GOSPER 4-H RULES & REGULATIONS

Who is eligible to enter?

Youth officially enrolled in the Phelps County and the Gosper County 4-H program who are eight (8) years of age through 18 years of age on December 31 of the prior year (Jan 1 of current year) are eligible to exhibit at the Phelps or Gosper County Fair. 4-H eligibility is determined based on the 4-H age. 4-H age is the age of the member on December 31 of the previous year. The first year of eligibility for the regular 4-H program is the 4-H age of eight (8) and the last year of eligibility is 4-H age of eighteen (18).

Phelps County FFA members must follow the 4-H age requirements and may exhibit in the Junior Livestock Shows and FFA static exhibit areas.

4-H Clover Kids, are youth ages 5-7 before January 1 current year (4-H age) and are eligible to participate in the Phelps and Gosper County Fairs as a non-competitive 4-H Clover Kid member in selected project areas. See the 4-H Clover Kid section.

Exhibits must represent the project or projects in which the **4-H'er is enrolled as of June 15, 2024,** and must have been completed as a result of the project. Extension Staff must approve all 4-H entries before June 15.

PRE-ENTRY is requested for **all** fair contests and exhibits at the county fair. **Pre-entry for exhibits by July 5, 2024** 4-H'ers are requested to pre-enter all exhibits and contests that they are considering entering or bringing to the fair.

The Phelps County and Gosper County 4-H Council have adopted the following county only policy: 4-H enrollment and Livestock ID deadlines will be enforced with no person competing for county fair placings who have not met the deadlines. Late enrollment by 4-H members means they can elect to participate in the event. The exhibit will be judged but the exhibit will be lowered one ribbon placing. 4-H'ers will be allowed a **ONE TIME ONLY** exception from this policy per 4-H career. Grievances will be taken on request to the 4-H Council for action.

The Phelps County and Gosper County 4-H Councils have adopted the following policy: The official 4-H enrollment deadline to participate in the Phelps or Gosper county fair events is June 15, 2024.

June 15, 2024 is the 4-H enrollment deadline for the submission of:

- 4-H Online Enrollment (v2.4honline.com)
- Selection of 4-H curriculum projects.
- Animal Affidavit (Animal ID Sheets), except Market Beef and District Horse affidavits which are due earlier)
- YQCA certification requirements. Website—https://4h.unl.edu/yqca
- Premise ID

4-H members must show their own animals, unless excused by the superintendent. This does not apply when a member has two animals in the same class.

Who owns the project? All animals and poultry in the 4-H show must be owned by the exhibitor and ownership certified where required on the appropriate forms in the Extension Office. Dog Eligibility: Exhibitor should provide primary care and training for the dog. The dog should reside with the exhibitor or be cared for by the exhibitor the majority of the year. Horse and Dairy members may use animals owned by another person if a completed affidavit is at the Extension Office by June 15.

<u>Livestock Animals</u> Livestock Show Regulations in the 4-H Animal Science/Livestock Policy Handbook will apply to this show. Animals are considered to be beef, sheep, hog, dairy, dairy goats, meat goats, horse, dogs, cats, rabbits, poultry and pets. Dogs eligibility is listed under the Dog section in the premium book.

<u>Cats, dogs, rabbits, poultry and pets</u> do not need affidavit forms by the **June 15 deadline** for county fair shows. However, dogs, cats and ferrets must meet vaccination requirements as stated under their respective sections by July 10. Vaccinations must be current on county fair show date. Rabbits, that will be exhibited at the State Fair must be have their ears tattooed the August 10 deadline.

Where and when are entries due? All Family and Consumer Science, Ag-related and Misc. entries will be exhibited in the County Ag Center. All Phelps and Gosper 4-H exhibits in the food preparation and preservation area, Favorite Food Show/Culinary Contest, Child Development, Clothing and Home Environment area will be judged by the interview method. In addition, Gosper County interview judges 4-H Photography exhibits, also. CONTACT your County Extension Office for an appointment. All other static exhibits, (Other 4-H Family and Consumer Science, Ag-related and Miscellaneous) entries not involved in the interview

judging process will be entered between 8:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. on Monday, July 22, 2024 for Phelps County AND between 1:00 and 4:00 p.m., on TUESDAY, July 23, 2024 for Gosper County.

Static Exhibit Entry cards are pre-printed by the Extension Office and are available in the Family Fair Packet prior to the county fair. Only exhibits listed in the Premium List will be judged.

Livestock entries will be housed in the barns on the fair grounds. No entry except horses, dogs, cats, and pets such as hamsters and gerbils, will be removed until [Wednesday/Phelps] or [Friday/Gosper] without consent of the superintendent.

<u>Will care be taken of exhibits?</u> A stall will be furnished for livestock and cages provided for rabbit and poultry. Bedding will be furnished free of charge, but members will bring their own feed, feed troughs, pails and feeding equipment. In Phelps County, hog, goat and sheep members will be asked to purchase additional bedding beyond the initial allotment.

All possible diligence and care will be used to prevent loss or injury to articles or animals. A night watchman will have charge of all animals between 9 p.m. and 7 a.m.. Owners will not be permitted to stay with stock at night unless given special permission. It is hereby expressly stipulated that the management of the Fair will not in any way be responsible for accidents that may occur on the Fair Grounds.

How Many Entries? Only one entry number may be made except in the Livestock/Animal Division, in which a Phelps 4-H/FFA member or a Gosper 4-H member may enter

BEEF: 2 breeding beef, 3 market beef (plus 1 bred and fed in Phelps Only), 1 junior breeding beef (Gosper only), 1 cow-calf pair (Gosper Only), 1 bucket calf, 1 second year bucket calf, 2 stocker feeders, 3 dairy; **GOATS:** 3 market goats, 1 lottery goat, 2 breeding goats, 3 dairy goats;

SWINE: Phelps-3 market hogs plus 1 lottery hog, Gosper-No more than 4 Swine with 1 Lottery and 1 Breeding;

SHEEP: 3 market lambs, 1 lottery lamb, 2 breeding sheep;

OTHER: 4 rabbits plus 1 showmanship rabbit, 4 companion animals, 5 horses, 3 "novelty" sheep (Phelps only), 3 "novelty" goats (Phelps only) and 5 poultry. If an exhibitor shows 4-H and FFA exhibits, the total number of animals shall not exceed these limits.

No animal may be shown in both breeding and market classes. When there is no competition, the entry will be placed according to merit at the judge's discretion.

The modified Danish System will be used in making the placings, except where noted.

Purple ribbons will be awarded at the time of judging of the livestock classes. The top two animals of each class which meet the weight and age requirements will return to the arena for selection of the champions. Grand and Reserve Champion will be selected.

State Fair Entries: All State Fair entries will be selected by the judge except animal entries. Static entries selected must also have received a purple ribbon at the county fair when selected by a judge. Starting in 2024 the age of eligibility will change to 8 years of age before January 1 (of the current year) for all in-person events (livestock, contests, fashion shows). In areas where the 4-H'er's presence is not required (i.e. static exhibits), all 4-H members are eligible for State Fair competition. All of the State Fair quotas will not be filled unless selected by the judge. The decision of the judge will be final in all classes. Please refer to State Fair competition guidelines for specific information.

What is proper 4-H attire? Exhibitors showing beef, dairy, sheep, dog, cat, pets, and rabbit are required to wear either a white shirt with the official 4-H chevron attached, or the official Phelps/Gosper County 4-H t-shirt and dark (blue or black) jeans. Shorts or "colored" jeans are not acceptable. NO red, yellow or other colored jeans. FFA members showing FFA identified livestock will follow the 4-H Rules except they will wear the designated FFA t-shirt. The FFA Chapter advisor will designate the official t-shirt for their FFA Chapter.

Horse exhibitors shall follow the rules according to the Nebraska 4-H Horse Show & Judging Guide (4-H 373).

Exhibitors of beef, diary, sheep, dog, cat, pet, rabbit and hog will show without a hat. Pet, dog, cat and rabbit exhibitors will wear sturdy, closed toe shoes while showing.

When are premiums paid?

Phelps County: The Phelps County Fair Board implemented the policy in 2021 that Phelps County 4-H members do not need to turn in a record book for their 4-H premium money. The 4-H premium list will be submitted to the Phelps County Fair Board and the premium money will be awarded at the Fall 4-H awards banquet. Youth not attending the banquet may pick premiums and any awards at the Phelps County Extension Office following the banquet.

Gosper County: The Gosper County Ag Society implemented the policy in 2019 that Gosper County 4-H members do not need to turn in a record book for their 4-H premium money. The Extension Office will submit a record of premium earned following the fair to the youth for corrections. The Fair Board will use the individual records to award cash premium at the annual 4-H Recognition Banquet in the fall. If youth do not attend the annual banquet to pick up their premium money, they may pick it up at the Gosper Extension Office. It will not be mailed.

International Association of Fairs and Expositions National Code of Show Ring Ethics

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honest and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the

advancement of agricultural education. All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics may forfeit awards and auction proceeds and may be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors.

The act of entering of an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

All projects that will be enrolled in the ShoWorks program to be shown at the 2024 County Fair have an enrollment deadline of JULY 5.

4-H AUCTION Questions & Answers

Purpose: The primary function of the Phelps County and the Gosper County 4-H Auction is to support and contribute to the 4-H Foundation in Phelps County and the 4-H Council in Gosper County. In turn, the Foundation/Council is committed to providing or supporting 4-H learning experiences in all areas of the individual County 4-H program. The auction will also provide public awareness of the individual County 4-H program in addition to providing participating youth a marketing experience and an opportunity to complete their 4-H projects.

Who is eligible?—Phelps County Eligibility

To be eligible to participate in the 4-H Auction, the youth must be a current enrolled 4-H member of the County they are exhibiting in and of eligible 4-H age, enrolled in the 4-H project areas that are eligible for the auction and have met all 4-H ownership, identification and entry deadlines. FFA members from the BerMis and Holdrege chapters are eligible to participate in the Phelps County 4-H Auction provided they follow all 4-H policies. FFA members must be enrolled in FFA and be of eligible 4-H age, be enrolled in the FFA project areas that are eligible for the 4-H Auction and have met all FFA ownership identification and entry deadlines. To be eligible for the auction, an animal must be identified and shown in 4-H and sold by the 4-H owner/exhibitor who entered it, or must be identified and shown in FFA and sold by the FFA owner/exhibitor who entered it, unless excused by the Livestock Division Committee and 4-H Auction Committee; due to serious illness, disability (due to injury, e.g. broken arm or leg) or the funeral of a relative or close friend to the owner/exhibitor.

Each participant is limited to participation in only one 4-H County Fair Auction, FFA County Fair Auction, Junior Livestock County Fair Auction or other County Fair special premiums program per year, whether 4-H, FFA or other organization.

4-H members are expected to be in 4-H appropriate dress when participating in the 4-H Auction. Review the current premium book for the description of "4-H dress". FFA members are expected to be in FFA appropriate dress when participating in the 4-H Auction. Review the current premium book for the description of FFA dress.

Who is eligible?—Gosper County Eligibility

To be eligible to participate in the 4-H Auction, the youth must be a current enrolled 4-H member of the County they are exhibiting in and of eligible 4-H age, enrolled in the 4-H project areas that are eligible for the auction and have met all 4-H ownership, identification and entry deadlines. To be eligible for the auction, an animal must be identified and shown in 4-H and sold by the 4-H owner/exhibitor who entered it, unless excused by the Livestock Division Committee and 4-H Auction Committee; due to serious illness, disability (due to injury, e.g. broken arm or leg) or the funeral of a relative or close friend to the owner/exhibitor.

Every auction participant is limited to participation in only one 4-H County Fair Auction or County Fair special premiums program per year.

4-H members are expected to be in 4-H appropriate dress when participating in the 4-H Auction. Review the current premium book for the description of "4-H dress".

What 4-H projects are eligible for the auction?

Phelps County: Market beef, market lamb, market goat, and market hog projects are eligible. In Phelps County, to be eligible for the 4-H Auction, animal must be exhibited in person by the 4-H owner /exhibitor at both the county fair show in which the animal is involved and at the 4-H Auction or must be exhibited in person by the FFA owner/exhibitor at both the county fair show in which the animal is involved and at the 4-H Auction.

Gosper County: Market beef, market lamb, market goat, and market hog projects are eligible. In Gosper county, to be eligible for the 4-H Auction, animal must be exhibited in person by the 4-H owner/exhibitor at both the county fair show in which the animal is involved and at the 4-H Auction.

4-H and FFA Exhibitors will **NOT** be allowed to sell underweight market animals in the Auction. *Animals not eligible to participate in the auction are listed under each specie. Refer to individual specie sections for minimum and maximum weights.* Animals who do not make weight requirements are not eligible to be sold. No diseased, prolapsed, or otherwise "sick" animals will be sold on auction, despite meeting all other requirements.

In PHELPS County 4-H members exhibiting at the NE State Fair where their presence is required may receive a State Fair Incentive from the Phelps County 4-H Foundation if the 4-H member DID NOT participate in the Phelps County 4-H Auction. The incentive is available in the following project areas: small animal, dog, poultry, rabbit, horse, fashion show, presentation contest and judging/skill-a-thon contests. This incentive is one time per year, not one time per contest/event.

2024 Phelps County Premium Auction Policy

The Phelps County Premium Auction is provided in partnership with the Phelps County Ag Society. Starting in 2023, The Phelps County 4-H Auction will be "premium only" for market beef, goat, lamb and swine. Each eligible exhibitor will be allowed 2 animal lots. A "premium only" auction is defined as an event in which change of ownership of the animal is not the intent; but the intent is only to provide a monetary premium to accompany the ribbon earned by the project. Absolutely no change of ownership will occur during the live premium auction. Youth selling their animals by packer bid and participating in the premium auction should receive two checks, one for the actual market value of the animal and one for the premium auction money. Exhibitors will receive 80% of their premium auction money with 20% being retained to support the Phelps County 4-H Foundation. Youth who wish to sell ownership of their animal will have the opportunity to sign up for the appropriate packer for beef, goat, and lamb (not available for swine) or make their own arrangements for private sale following the premium auction. Youth will receive 100% of their check from the species appropriate packer. The Phelps County Ag Society will coordinate packers each year. Sign up time/location for packers is TBD. It is important to note that the premium auction and sale of an animal to a packer are two separate events. Exchange of ownership for each eligible project must happen after the conclusion of the Premium Auction. Phelps County 4-H/FFA members ages 8—18 as of Jan. 1 exhibiting the species noted above are eligible to participate in the Phelps County 4-H Auction. Youth are eligible to designate 2 market animals of the same or different species noted.

In GOSPER County—The Gosper County 4-H Auction is a "premium only" auction, NO BASE BID option available. 4-H Exhibitors who exhibit market beef, swine, sheep and goats are eligible to participate in the 4-H Auction with two (2) animal lots. No change of ownership will take place during the auction. In order to fund the Gosper Co. 4-H Council, twenty (20) percent will be retained from each 4-H auction entry. The remaining eighty (80) percent will be awarded to each participant.

Who is in charge of the 4-H Auction?

The Gosper County 4-H Council under the umbrella of The Elwood Community Foundation is the organizer, sponsor and in charge of the Gosper County 4-H Auction.

The Phelps County Ag. Society/Fair Board is the Auction Clerk and Sponsor.

The Council/Foundation monies retained are a percentage of the premium above the base bid or market value of the animal. In Gosper County, the sale of the animal is a separate transaction. The 20% premium is only withheld on the Premium Lots offered during the auction.

This funding will be used for on-going 4-H enhancement programs in **all** 4-H program areas, such as educational scholarships, 4-H trips and conferences, contest support, and 4-H educational experiences and materials, such as Citizenship Washington Focus, 4-H leader training, 4-H Council support and general 4-H program promotion. In addition to providing experiences on the county level, the 4-H Council/Foundation provides support for the 4-H learning experiences on the state and national levels. The monies will also be used to cover expenses in the normal operation and maintenance of the county 4-H Auction.

How to enroll in the 4-H Auction...

All animal lots must be enrolled on an Auction Enrollment sheet to be eligible for the 4-H Auction. **Gosper County Exhibitors** and Phelps County exhibitors will have <u>one hour</u> from the completion of the show in which the animals were shown to sign up their livestock for the Auction.

Auction enrollment sheets will be available at the Livestock office on the fairgrounds. The sheets need to include the following information: exhibitor/owner of the animal, animal identification, species, sex of the animal, live show weight, placing in the live show, plus any special award received, such as championship.

What is the 4-H Auction sale order?

The Auction lots will be sold in the following order: Grand Champions, Division Champions, Purple Ribbon Animals, Blue Ribbon Animals, Red Ribbon Animals and White Ribbon Animals. The lots will be sold by species, rotating the order of beef, sheep, goats and hogs each year. **Any late entries will be placed at the end of the auction.**

The sale of non-auction animals...

Market animals that do not participate in the auction may be sold following the conclusion of the sale to the species appropriate packer. Those animals must also be signed up on the enrollment sheets and marked "For Base Bid Only". **Animals must meet weight requirements to be sold for base bid.** No diseased, prolapsed, or otherwise "sick" animal will be sold on auction or for base bid, despite meeting all other requirements. These entry sheets should include exhibitor ID, animal ID, species, sex, live show weight and show placing such as ribbon award.

Responsibility of the Exhibitor

The 4-H owner/exhibitor (Phelps and Gosper counties) and the FFA owner/exhibitor (Phelps County) shall be responsible for any animal or animal carcass that is held or condemned due to residue of drugs, chemicals or feed additives or that exhibit signs of injection lesions.

Animals going home...

All animals not being sold in the auction or for base bid will be released at these times: Phelps County– Wednesday at 5:00 p.m.; Gosper County- Friday at 6:00 p.m.

ALL 4-H STATIC EXHIBITS SELECTED FOR THE STATE FAIR MUST RECEIVE A PURPLE RIBBON AND BE SELECTED BY THE JUDGE.

●4-H CLOVER KIDS IN GOSPER AND PHELPS COUNTY

Clover Kids is a special 4-H program for youth ages 5-7. Youth who have enrolled in a designated Clover Kids project anytime during the project year may bring an exhibit to the County Fair for display. Exhibits will be displayed during the fair. Exhibits will not be judged. Exhibits can be anything made by the Clover Kids member in support of the projects taken.

Clover Kids may exhibit up to three (3) entries in each 4-H project in which they have enrolled, with the exception of animal entries. Clover Kids may exhibit one animal per entry (species) under Exploring Animals (Letter I).

Clover Kids may "share" an animal for display at the county fair with a sibling that has properly identified their animal exhibit. Clover Kids are asked to identify their animals by the appropriate deadline but it is not required. Clover Kid animal entries must meet health and vaccination requirements as listed under the appropriate specie in the fair book.

Pre-entry is necessary for Clover Kids exhibits. Exploring Animals exhibits in Clover Kids are presented during the corresponding 4-H show. For example, Clover Kid Bucket Calves will be presented during the regular 4-H Bucket Calf show. Non animal Clover Kid exhibits are entered on Entry Day with the 4-H Static Exhibits.

Phelps/Gosper County 4-H Councils & Ag Society Award Policy

1. In the 4-H Section, exhibits will be judged according to research-based standards that indicate level of performance or quality of work. Purple ribbons designates an exhibit of superior quality that has met and exceeded all of the standards. Blue ribbons denote an above average exhibit that has met almost all of the standards in a way that surpasses the norm. Red ribbons indicate average quality and indicates that the exhibit has met the majority of standards in such a way that the benchmark was reached, but not exceeded. White ribbons indicate that the exhibit has not met the majority of the standards.

- 2. Plaques/trophies and awards will be presented to purple, then blue award county exhibits.
- 3. Presentation of all rosettes (Gosper) and trophies & awards (Phelps) will be made at the time of winning in competition, if possible.
- 4. Other plaques, trophies and/or awards will be presented at a special awards event at a specified time during the Phelps County Fair and the Gosper County Fair, or at a special awards presentation.

COMBINED PHELPS/GOSPER COUNTY FAIR CONTESTS

There are two fair contests that are held together between Phelps and Gosper counties. In 2024, the combined contests are the Speech Contest and the Horse Show.

In 2024, the Speech contest will be held in Phelps County. The Horse Show will be held in Gosper County. In 2025, these contests will rotate locations.

The rules for the competitions will be those of the host county, regardless of the county in which the 4-H'er is enrolled in the project. When Phelps County hosts the contest, all participants will follow the Phelps County rules, and vice versa.

COMBINED EVENT GUIDELINES WHICH ARE DIFFERENT

Guidelines which may affect your participation in combined events when those events are held in Gosper or Phelps County: Below are some rules that are specific to each county. Be aware of these regulations when participating in a combined contest. <u>Gosper Award policy</u>: Plaques, trophies and special awards will be presented to only purple and blue award exhibits at the County Fair. Plaques, trophies, and award presentations will be made at a time following the county competition to work within the guidelines of the Gosper County Fair Award Policy. Awards are generally presented at the County 4-H Achievement Banquet. Selection of plaques and/or trophies to be awarded will be coordinated through the Gosper County 4-H Council and are sponsored by the Gosper County Fair Board. Plaques and/or trophies are to be awarded in areas where support is designated by the 4-H Council.

<u>Phelps Award Policy</u>: Presentation of all trophies and awards will be made at the time of winning in competition if possible. Other trophies and awards will be presented at a special awards night. Trophies are presented in accordance with 4-H Council policy and in areas where support is available.

•INVITATIONAL EVENTS

The Presentation Contest and Fashion Show Judging and public events will be conducted in Phelps County. Phelps County will invite and welcome Gosper County 4-H'ers to participate. Rules will follow those of the host county. Premiums will be paid by the 4-H'ers home county. In 2024, if selected, there will be designees from Phelps and Gosper county at the NE State Fair in Fashion Show.
