# <u>FASHION SHOW</u>

- Phelps & Gosper 4-H Fashion Contest to be held Monday, July 15, 2024 at the Phelps Co. Ag Center, Holdrege.
- Phelps & Gosper PUBLIC 4-H Fashion Show to be held Monday evening, July 15 at the Phelps Ag Center.

County fair trophies in Fashion Show and Shopping in Style will be awarded by age divisions as follows: Junior 8-10, Intermediate 11-13, and Senior 14 and up.

Clothing members may model two entries in the Fashion Show, one entry per class number. To model, you must be enrolled in the corresponding clothing or consumer management curriculum project area. In order to participate in the Public Fashion Show, you must participate in judging. By participating in the fashion show judging, you are expected to participate in the Public Fashion Show. An outfit cannot be modeled twice under two different class numbers, i.e. a simple top and simple bottom. Each participant must fill out an entry form with the description, itemized cost, and narrative for the narrator and judge. Entry forms are available at the Extension office and are mailed in June. **Garments should be age appropriate.**Score sheet SF117 is available at http://4h.unl.edu/web/4h/statefair4h under 4-H Fashion Show Scoresheet Index.

The following are not considered for State Fair Fashion Show: 1) Textile clothing accessories; 2) Garments containing inappropriate language or images.

Entries marked with a (+) are NOT State Fair Eligible.

**NOTE**: Upcycled garments and flannel lounge pants ARE allowed at the county fair Fashion Show.

## **BEYOND THE NEEDLE**

Purple 3.00, Blue 2.75, Red 2.25, White 1.75

Beyond the Needle is a project for 4-H'ers of all ages. When selecting special awards, the age of the 4-H member will be considered using the following guidelines: Beginning Level, ages 8, 9, 10; Intermediate Level, ages 11, 12, 13 and Senior Level ages 14 and up. (4-H age)

<u>Class C410010</u> Modeled "Beyond the Needle" Embellished Garment(s) with an Original Design. Garment is created using beginning, intermediate or advanced techniques as defined in the project manual. Designs are the original idea of the 4-H'er using the elements and principles of design to make an original statement. Note: Beginning level techniques are not State Fair eligible as defined in the project manual.

<u>Class C410015.</u> Modeled "Beyond the Needle" Garment Constructed From Original Designed Fabric. Fabric yardage is designed first, then a garment is constructed from that fabric. Other embellishments may be added.

<u>Class C410020</u> Model "Beyond the Needle" Textile Arts Garment(s) Garment is constructed using new unconventional materials. Examples: rubber bands, plastic, duct tape.

Class C410025 Modeled "Beyond the Needle" Wearable Technology Garment- Garment has integrated technology into its design.

## **STEAM 1—Sewing Fundamentals**

<u>+Class C410901</u> STEAM Level 1: Garment or Accessory Parade—Model an item (garment or accessory) made from STEAM 1 project guidelines. <u>+Class C410902</u> STEAM Level 1 Second Entry Garment or Accessory Parade: Model a second item (garment or accessory) made from STEAM 1 project guidelines.

+Class C410903 Knit/Crochet Level 1—Modeled Level 1 Knit or Crochet Accessory such as scarf, hat, slippers, etc.

## MIDDLE— COUNTY UNIT

#### STEAM 2

<u>Class C410030</u> Modeled Constructed STEAM Clothing 2 Garments: 4-H members who have enrolled in or who have completed STEAM Clothing 3 projects are not eligible to enter STEAM Clothing 2.

Possible types of STEAM Clothing 2 garments include: <u>Dress</u>; OR <u>Romper or Jumpsuit</u>; OR <u>Two-Piece Outfit Combination</u>—Skirt with top, vest or lined/unlined jacket; jumper and top; pants or shorts outfit (pants or shorts with top, vest, or lined/unlined jacket). **OR** a purchased top can be worn to complete a vest or lined/unlined jacket outfit with a constructed bottom. **OR** Upcycled Outfit Combination - must contain a complete constructed outfit (examples: if the top is upcycled, must include a constructed bottom, upcycled dress). Flannel lounge pants may be modeled at the county fair.

## ADVANCED-COUNTY UNIT

Premiums: P-5.00, B-4.75, R-4.00, W-3.00

#### STEAM 3

Class C410040 Model Constructed STEAM Clothing 3 Garment(s): Possible types of STEAM Clothing 3 garments include: Dress or formal; OR Skirted Outfit Combination (skirt with top, vest, or lined/unlined jacket OR jumper and shirt) A purchased top can be worn to complete a vest or jacket outfit with a skirt, pants or shorts; OR Pants or Shorts Outfit Combination (pants or shorts with top, vest, or lined/unlined jacket) A purchased top can be worn to complete a vest or jacket outfit with a skirt, pants or shorts; OR Romper or Jumpsuit; OR Specialty Wear (for example: swim wear, costumes, western wear-chaps, chinks, riding attire or hunting gear); OR Non-tailored Lined or Unlined Jacket or Coat, additional pieces with jacket or coat may either be constructed or purchased; OR Tailored Coat, Blazer, Suit Jacket, or Outerwear. Additional pieces with coat, blazer, jacket or outerwear may either be constructed or purchased; OR Upcycled Outfit Combination - must contain a complete constructed outfit (examples: if the top is upcycled, must include a constructed bottom, upcycled dress).

## KNITTED or CROCHETED

Class C410050 Modeled Knitted or Crocheted Clothing (Level 2 or 3) Knitted garment using pattern stitches such as diamond, block, twist or seed/moss stitches or advanced knitting stitches such as pass slip stitch over, double-pointed needle knitting, cable, Turkish, tamerna, plait, germaine, feather and fan or knitting with one or more patterns such as Aran or Fair Isle.

Crocheted garment using pattern stitches such as texture, shell, cluster or mesh stitches or advance crochet stitches such as afghan, broomstick, hairpin lace, design motifs or pattern stitches.

Garment can be a sweater, cardigan, dress, coat, a top and bottom or a two piece ensemble.

#### SHOPPING IN STYLE

Shopping in Style entries are required to include a photo with Form SF184 with their entry. The form will be mailed in June to county 4-H members registered for the project, or a "writtable" form is available on the Phelps/Gosper 4-H Premium Book website under "Contests" Class C410060 - Modeled Shopping In Style Purchased Outfit and Written Report SF184. Participants must be enrolled in the Shopping In Style 4-H Project to enter. The curriculum is developed and designed for youth ages 9 and older, however, 4-H aged 8 year olds are allowed to participate. The curriculum helps the 4-H youth to strengthen their consumer skills when purchasing clothing. Participants must model a complete outfit. All pieces of the garment must be purchased.

Phelps/Gosper Contest Awards: When selecting awards for class C410060, the age of the 4-H member will be considered using the following guidelines: Beginning Level– 8, 9, 10; Intermediate Level– 11, 12, 13; Senior Level-14 and older (4-H age).

+Class C410970 — Modeled \$20 Challenge Outfit — 4-H'er must be enrolled in Shopping in Style 4-H project to enter. Goals are to: become a wise consumer, learn about garment care and quality and wardrobe planning. Exhibit will be complete wearable outfit worn as purchased or altered/remade.

- Outfit must be purchased. Suggestions include garage sale, thrift store, consignment or resale shop such as Goodwill.
- Cost of outfit must be \$20 or less, not including shoes, accessories, undergarments.
- Must be an "outfit". (Example: shirt & top, dress)
- Modeled Entry MUST include one page report stating the following: Items purchased; Cost of items; Modifications made to items; Why this was a good buy; How outfit works into wardrobe; Why outfit was selected; Fit; Quality and Care.

When selecting awards for class +C410970 (County Projects Only), the age of the 4-H member will be considered using the following guidelines: Beginning Level- 8, 9, 10; Intermediate Level- 11, 12, 13; Senior Level-14 and older (4-H age).

## **JUST FOR FUN Fashion Show**

Premiums: P-2.50, B-2.25, R-1.75, W-1.25

<u>Class +C410910</u> Anyone enrolled in a clothing project is eligible to enter this category. Can be anything that the individual has made. 4-H'er must be enrolled in a clothing project. Could be a garment made for someone else, and has to be modeled by the person for which it was made.
