
4-H LEADER TRAINING

BEEF: The County Fair Market Beef Weigh-In will be Saturday, February 3 from 10 am to Noon at Columbus Sales Pavilion. This is the only weigh-in time offered so get it on your calendar!

- Led cattle are NOT required to weigh in for rate-of-gain, but MUST attend on February 3 for DNA pulls. Pen of 3 cattle are required to use EID tags again this year, rather than the red county tags. EID tags cost \$2.53/each and county fair tags cost \$1.00/each both can be purchased at the Extension office in January.
- **NEW:** To alleviate some wait times for families weighing in cattle on February 3rd. The following schedule will be followed.
 - o Families with 1-10 head of cattle will weigh in and/or DNA pulled 10:00 10:45 am.
 - Families with 11 or more head will weigh in and/or DNA pulled 10:45 am 12:00 Noon.
 (Families with 11 or more head are asked to please wait to back up to chute till families with less head are done.)

DAIRY GOATS: Five dairy goats are available for free for any 4-H'er interested in learning, caring, and showing them at the Platte County Fair. Goats will remain at the Littlefield Farm in Surprise. On-line enrollment is open to enroll or re-enroll your 4-H'er(s) for 2024. 4-H leaders along with Council members are required to enroll or re-enroll for the new year.

The enrollment website is https://v2.4honline.com or you can go to our county website at http://platte.unl.edu for enrolling or re-enrolling instructions to the 4-H Online enrollment website. Google Chrome and Firefox are the recommended web browsers to use when enrolling online.

Enrollment fee for 2024 is \$5.00 per 4-H'er and no charge for leaders or Council members. Payment is required at end of enrollment process.

NEW for 2024 Enrollment: A simplified project list has been implemented for the new enrollment year. This is to make enrolling in 4-H easier for families and promote consistency statewide. Remember this is <u>project enrollment</u> NOT fair exhibit entries. A project is centered around a topic of interest to members. A project should include a series of learning experiences related to that topic. When you enroll in 4HOnline, you sign up for projects.

If you are re-enrolling in 4-H, please DO NOT create a new enrollment. Use your email address and password from last year to log in and start your re-enrollment for this year.

4-H Photography Workshop



This skill-building workshop will cover beginning photography basics. Each youth will receive a photography level 1 workbook to utilize during our sessions. This workshop will meet multiple times and it is **important** to attend <u>each</u> session as the lessons build on each other. It is required to bring your own camera or picture-taking device (phone, tablet, etc.). The lessons are tailored to traditional cameras, but if you are using something else, like a phone or tablet, we will do our best to help you. You will need digital storage space as we will be taking a lot of pictures. There is a maximum of 10 spots available – so sign up early! Once it does warm up, we will be going outside and using the skills that we learned to take pictures. Meetings will take place from 5:30 – 6:30 in the Extension office unless otherwise stated (when it is warmer, and we are outside we may meet somewhere else and lessons might be 30 minutes longer)



Farrowed and Owned Swine Cohort

A Farrowed and Owned Breeding and Market Swine division for youth interested in learning more about the swine industry is available again at the Nebraska State Fair in 2024! The Nebraska 4-H Farrowed and Owned Swine Cohort is designed to enhance the traditional 4-H swine project and cultivate the next generation of leaders in the swine industry by providing opportunities focusing on swine production as a goal of the 4-H member's project, along with accurate and complete record-keeping, industry knowledge, and engagement by the 4-H member. In order to participate, youth must be 4-H age 10-18 as of January 1, 2024, complete YQCA, farrowed their project animal(s) and participate in monthly virtual educational meetings.

Youth participating in the Farrowed and Owned Cohort will:

- Network with 4-H members across the state who are also participating in the cohort experience.
- Participate in learning opportunities hosted by Extension Swine Specialist Benny Mote about biosecurity, meat science, economics of raising swine and more.
- The cohort will meet virtually the first Sunday of the month at 7:00 p.m. CT, the months of February, March, April, May and June.
- Gain knowledge related to their project and the swine industry as a whole.
- Maintain records related to swine management and basic care.
- Exhibit their Farrowed and Owned project animals at the 2024 Nebraska State Fair with the opportunity for special recognition as a result of participating in the cohort.


