YQCA for all livestock exhibitors is **Due JUNE 15, 2024**

If you plan on showing beef, swine, sheep, goats, poultry, or rabbits you are required to complete annual quality assurance training through YQCA.

How do youth get certified?

Annual certification is required. Youth may earn their certification in one of the following ways:

- Instructor-led training (\$8/child) \$3 online fee plus \$5 in-person fee
- Online course (\$12/child)
- Test-Out exam (12 & 15-year-olds only; online course only; cost varies)

All enrollment for YQCA training (Web Based or In-Person) must be done through the YQCA site. We do NOT take registrations through the Extension Office.

Cost \$12 for the online course - \$8 for the in-person training.

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) is a national, multi-species youth livestock quality assurance program. It is an annual training open to youth 8-21 years of age and focuses on food safety, animal well-being, and life skill development.
