An Illustrated 4-H Presentation, given by one individual or a team of two individuals, is a live presentation with a formal talk where youth will use visual aids (such as props, posters, computer-based visuals, handouts, video, etc.) to show and tell others how to do something. The judges will view the entire presentation and engage in a question-and-answer session following the presentation.

- Youth do not have to be enrolled in 4-H to compete at the county level. 4-H enrollment is required to advance to the state level.
- 4-H Attire is NOT required. Dress appropriately.
- Presentations not within the allotted time limit will be lowered one ribbon placing.
- If team members are not in the same age division, they must compete in the age division of the oldest team member.
- Intermediate and Senior participants are eligible for the state competition. Participants must receive a purple ribbon to advance to state.
- One Grand Champion individual or team from the illustrated presentation division will be selected to represent our area in the Premier Communication Event June 17 & 18th in Lincoln.

Clover Kid Show & Tell	5 - 7 years	Under 3 Minutes	Non-competitive class for Clover Kids to show and tell about one of their favorite things. Does not have to be 4-H related.	Clover Kid Ribbon
Junior Individual Presentations	8 - 10 years	3-5 Minutes	<p>All presentations must be original and should be related to what the 4-H youth is learning through 4-H educational experience focused on the priorities of career and college readiness, community development, entrepreneurship, food supply confidence, healthy living, leadership development, and STEM.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Presentations should include an introduction (the “why” portion of the topic), a body (the “show and tell” portion of the topic, and a conclusion/summary (the “what” portion of the topic. ▪ Presenters using computer-based visuals may bring files on a USB drive that is PC formatted. Participants may also provide their own computer or other equipment as needed; however, participants must be able to connect their computer to a HDMI plug on the television. ▪ Live animals may be used in the presentation. All fair livestock health requirements must be followed. Animals can only remain in the presentation area while the owner is present. IF USING AN ANIMAL, STAFF MUST BE NOTIFIED AHEAD OF TIME. 	All participants receive a ribbon. Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded in each age division (team and individuals are not separated for awards).
