ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

An exhibitor must exhibit MARKET BEEF, FEEDER CALVES, BUCKET CALVES, BREEDING HEIFERS, and COW/CALF PAIRS that have been properly identified under their name.

Please see "**4-H & FFA ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION PROCEDURES - SAUNDERS COUNTY**" for ID requirements.

The IDs for all beef entries will be checked by beef committee at check in. Final decision as to the class in which an animal will be shown will rest with the beef committee.

QUALITY ASSURANCE REQUIREMENT: Nebraska 4-H Program is REQUIRING members (8 - 18 years old) exhibiting BEEF to be certified in Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA). This program is mandated by the Nebraska 4-H Program and has been implemented into the Saunders County 4-H Program. Therefore, ALL youth exhibiting BEEF at the Saunders County Fair are required to be YQCA certified by June 15 of the current year to be eligible to exhibit.

DRESS CODE: Exhibitors are required to wear the sponsored Saunders County 4-H t-shirt. Dark blue jeans and hard-soled shoes or boots are appropriate. No hats, caps or other types of headgear are to be worn while exhibiting. (SOURCE: Nebraska State Fair - 4-H Fair book)

BEDDING: Bedding will be provided however there is a \$5 bedding charge per head for market and breeding beef and a \$2.50 charge per head for feeder and bucket calves. Fees must be paid to Fairgrounds 4-H office

BLOCKING CHUTES: Chutes will be kept to the west side of the beef barn. Safety ropes are recommended on all cattle.

Grooming Rules:

All livestock shows will be Blow and Go; animals may be clipped, blown, and brushed or combed to enhance their appearance. Guidelines for the Blow and Go show:

1. All animals will be shown free of any adhesive, glue, paint, or powder products.
2. Any compounds that have adhesive qualities that when applied cannot be combed or brushed through or alter the color of the animal are forbidden. These products include but are not limited to commonly used adhesives and colorants such as Prime Time, EZ Comb, Tail Adhesive, Natural Hold, Ultra White Touch-Up, Black Touch Up, Black Finisher, black show foam, and baby powder.
3. Alcohol, water, oil, foam or any water or alcohol-based products with no adhesives or glue qualities, or artificial colorings are permitted. These products include conditioners and commonly used sprays such as Kleen Sheen, Revive, Final Bloom, Pink Oil, white show foam, Freshen Up, Silk, and Sudden Impact.
4. Any animal found to have prohibited products applied (adhesive, glue, paint, or powder products) will be disqualified from competition. Any premiums (physical or monetary) will be forfeited, and no refunds will be made. All animals will be subject to visual inspection and/or toweling (before and/or after entering the show ring) for the presence of adhesive, glue, paint, or powder products. Toweling of the animal may include, but is not limited to, the topline, legs, chest, belly, flank, and cod/udder areas. If, after inspection, the animal is found to have adhesive, glue, paint, or powder products applied it will be disqualified from competition. Any premiums (physical or monetary) will be forfeited, and no refunds will be made.

SHOWMANSHIP GUIDELINES:

- Exhibitors sign up for showmanship during check-in. They may drop after check-in deadline but may not sign up after deadline.
- Members taking part in a showmanship class will be judged on their skill as showmen and on the appearance their animal makes before the judges.
- Any animal may be shown in only ONE showmanship class.
- In showmanship classes, a 4-H member can ONLY exhibit an animal that has been officially identified in their name AND that they have entered in the live show. Exhibitors may NOT exhibit another exhibitor's animal (including siblings) in the showmanship competition.

WEIGHT:

- Weigh Cards - Exhibitors will self-declare weights of all market animals (an official weigh-in will not be conducted by show officials). Weigh cards must be completed and turned in during the designated check-in time and location. Animals DO NOT need to be present at the time of turning in their weigh cards. The weight listed on the weigh card will become that animal's official declared weight to be used for assignment to a class and for weigh-back purposes.
- Weigh Backs - A weigh back will be incorporated for all 1st and 2nd place purples in each market class. A 5% variance from the weight declared at check-in will be allowed. Animals not meeting the 5% variance from the declared weight at check-in will be lowered one ribbon group and will not be eligible for any champion awards.
- All market steers and heifers will be weighed, and the classes will be divided by weight.
- If 4-Her has more than one animal per class, they have the option of moving that animal up one class.
- Market heifer show will be divided by weight, selecting Champion & Reserve Champion Market Heifer
- Market steer show will be broken into Lightweight, Middleweight, and Heavyweight steer divisions. Champion & Reserve Champion Market steers will be selected from each of the three divisions.
- The same prize money will be awarded in each weight division.

COUNTY BRED

- Entry in Market Beef County Bred class **must have been born within the boundaries of Saunders County.**
- This entry WILL be included in the maximum entries for species.
- Producer signature is required on animal ID affidavit to be eligible

AWARDS:

- A Champion & Reserve Champion market heifer will be awarded to the top two animals in the market heifer show. Selection will be made from the Champion & Reserve Champion market heifer.
- A Champion & Reserve Champion market steer will be awarded to the top two animals in the market steer show. Selection will be made from the Champion & Reserve Champion Lightweight, Middleweight, and Heavyweight steers.
- A Grand Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded to the top two animals in the market beef show. Selection will be made from the Champion and Reserve Champion Steer and Champion and Reserve Champion Heifer and Champion County Bred.
- To be eligible to compete for Champion and Reserve Champion, the animal must have received a PURPLE ribbon.

AUCTION:

- AUCTION DATE: Sunday, August 1 at 1:30 p.m.
- Confirmation deadline for auction: Saturday, July 31 at 12 Noon.
- FEE: Assessed to 4-H member to defray cost of marketing animals. Fee owed: beef - \$2/head; sheep, goats & swine - \$1/head; Pen of broilers - \$.50/pen. Fee owed by Saturday at 12 Noon.
- Each exhibitor is eligible to sell ONE market livestock animal on the Saunders County Fair Livestock Auction. Catch-An-Animal exhibitors are eligible to sell one market livestock animal PLUS one Catch-An-Animal.
- Exhibitors are NOT required to sell an animal if they want to and as long as the sale is conducted in conjunction with the fair.
- Order of sale in the live auction will follow ribbon placings as near as possible. Sale weight will be based on their show weight.
- Sellers must be present at the time their species is sold or plan for the animal to be brought to the sale ring by another 4-H exhibitor. Those showing up after their species is completed will not be allowed to sell late.
- An Ag Society member will be present at each local locker to verify animal identification upon harvest.
- Beef animals must meet the required weight minimum to be eligible for auction:
 - Steers: 1,000 pounds (minimum)
 - Heifers: 900 pounds (minimum)

BREEDING BEEF GUIDELINES:

- There will be classes for both Registered and Commercial breeding heifers. Registered heifers will show first, however both will compete for Breed Champion.
- Breeding heifers are ineligible for the market animal sale.
- Breeding heifer classes must follow the Fitting Guidelines ("Blow and Go") stated at the beginning of the beef section.
- Registered and Commercial breeding heifers must be properly identified by Ear Tattoos (according to the regulations set by the various national beef breed associations/ Bangs tattoos are NOT acceptable.)

REGISTERED BEEF BREEDING HEIFERS must have registration papers issued by Breed Association and must be in the exhibitor's, families, or family's business name. If registration is pending, they must show in the Commercial class. The registration number must accompany this entry. Registration papers will be checked by the beef committee.

JUNIOR BREEDING HEIFERS have the option of coming on Friday for the show and leaving right after the show is complete. However, they must verbally confirm and fill out entry tag on animals they will be exhibiting on **Thursday** during the Beef check-in and have calves present for hip height and check-in on Friday morning between 7:30 – 8:30 a.m. **If they come on Tuesday, they MUST stay until Sunday release time.**

AWARDS: Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons will be awarded in each breed. First and second place animals in each division may compete, provided they received a PURPLE ribbon. The Champion and Reserve Champion heifers in each breed are eligible to compete for the Supreme Breeding Heifer.

- Classes in the Breeding Heifer Divisions may be divided at the discretion of the beef committee.

COUNTY RAISED BREEDING BEEF GUIDELINES:

- Each breeding heifer listed is from the 4-Her's or family's herd who verifies it is from his/her own cow and was bred and calved in Saunders County.
- Each breeding heifer listed is being raised by the 4-H member(s) at a residence within Saunders County.
- Each breeding heifer listed is properly identified according to the current Saunders County 4-H Livestock Guidelines and have producer's signature is required on the Beef ID affidavit.
- Each breeding heifer listed is eligible to enter and exhibit in the Saunders County Fair County Raised Breeding Heifer Class.
- Each breeding heifer listed is NOT automatically entered in the Saunders County Fair County Raised Breeding Heifer Class.
- A breeding heifer may NOT enter/exhibit in more than one breeding heifer class (including the County Raised Breeding Heifer Class).
- The Champion and Reserve Champion of the County Bred & Owned Breeding Heifer Division will compete against the other Breeding Heifer division Champions and Reserve Champions for Supreme Champion Breeding Female and Reserve Supreme Champion Breeding Heifer.

- The feeder calf classes may be divided into classes at the discretion of the beef committee.
- Feeder calves exhibited in the feeder class are not eligible for the Breeding Heifer class.
- Feeder calf classes must follow the "Blow and Go" guidelines at the beginning of the beef section.
- Unless entered in the beef show as a cow/calf pair, the cows (dams) should not be brought to the fair.
- Feeder calves may arrive on the fairgrounds the day of the show and be excused following the show.
- Feeder Calves must have completed paperwork and tags

AWARDS:

- A Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded to the top two animals in the feeder calf show. Selection will be made from the Champion and Reserve Champion feeder steer, Champion, and Reserve Champion feeder heifer.
- To be eligible to compete for Champion and Reserve Champion, the animal must have received a PURPLE ribbon.

BUCKET CALF GUIDELINES

- Entry limit of ONE bucket calf per exhibitor.
- Bucket Calves are to be born between January 1 and June 1 of the current year, may be heifer or bull, dairy, or beef animal.
- Bucket calf record books are to be submitted to the Saunders County Fairgrounds 4-H office by 12 noon on Thursday.
- Exhibitors in this class must have calves that have been bucket fed, having owned the calf within two weeks of birth. Calves cannot have been on the cow.
- Calves shown as a Bucket Calf have the option of showing in the beef showmanship class, however they will have separate showmanship for bucket calf that will be counted for their showmanship score.
- The calf must have been taken care of by the 4-H member.
- Bucket calves should be clean when shown but no other clipping or grooming should be done to the animals.
- Show halters or rope halters may be used in the show ring. Show sticks are not required.
- Exhibitors of bucket calves have the option of keeping their calf at the fair during the entire fair OR bringing them and taking them home the day of the show.

HEALTH

- Cats shall be free of fleas, ticks and ear mites, ringworm, other parasites, and infectious diseases. Cats are required to have current Rabies, Distemper (Panleukopenia / Feline Enteritis), Feline Rhinotracheitis (Herpes), Calicivirus and Feline Leukemia vaccinations. If the cat is not declawed, the claws must be clipped. No expectant or nursing mother cats may enter.
- Any cat or kitten not meeting these health requirements will not be judged.
- The Saunders County Certificate of Vaccination for Cats and Ferrets **MUST BE SUBMITTED TO THE EXTENSION OFFICE BY JULY 1st AT 4:30 PM.** Certificate FOUND HERE: <https://go.unl.edu/2t4b>

HOUSING/DISPLAY

- Exhibitors should bring cats to the fairgrounds on the day of the show in proper carriers for exhibiting. Cardboard boxes are NOT allowed.
- Cats must have a collar or harness and leash on at all times when not in the carrier.
- Classes waiting to be judged will be on display.

ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

- An exhibitor must exhibit dairy cattle that have been identified under their name and properly identified on an official Nebraska 4-H and FFA Dairy Identification Affidavit (Rev. 1/16) and filed with the Nebraska Extension Office by June 15th of the current year.
- The IDs for all dairy cattle entries will be checked by superintendent when animal is brought to fair.
- Final decision as to the class in which an animal will be shown will rest with the superintendent.

QUALITY ASSURANCE REQUIREMENT: Nebraska 4-H Program is REQUIRING members (8 -18 years old) exhibiting DAIRY CATTLE to be certified in Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA). This program is mandated by the Nebraska 4-H Program and has been implemented into the Saunders County 4-H Program. Therefore, ALL youth exhibiting DAIRY CATTLE at the Saunders County Fair are required to be YQCA certified by June 15th of the current year to be eligible to exhibit.

BEDDING: There will be a \$5 per head bedding charge for all dairy animals housed for entire week. There is a \$2.50 per head bedding charge for milking cows which are there show day only. These fees will be payable at the time of check-in with the superintendent.

DRESS CODE: Exhibitors are to wear the sponsored 4-H t-shirt. Dairy exhibitors may wear dark blue jeans or white pants (preferred). Hard-soled shoes or boots are appropriate. No hats, caps or other types of headgear are to be worn while exhibiting. (SOURCE: Nebraska State Fair 4-H Fair book)

- Animals born after April 30th of current year are not eligible to show in the individual classes or in dairy herds.
- Yearlings that have calved, freshening prior to show, must be shown as Junior Two-Year Olds class.

DAIRY CATTLE JUNIOR HERD REQUIREMENTS:

A 4-H Dairy Cattle Junior Herd will consist of three animals that meet the following requirements:

- All three animals have been officially identified by the same 4-H member.
- All three animals have been entered and exhibited (at the current show) by the same 4-H member.
- All three animals must be the same dairy breed.
- All three animals may be grade or registered, or any combination of grade and registered; and at least one of the three animals must be a cow that has freshened long enough to have a 305 2X ME record in progress. Show management will verify the production records at the time of check-in.
- Herds will be scored and awarded ribbons based on the current Dairy Cattle Junior Herd Scorecard. Each exhibitor is expected to fill out their own score card and present it to the superintendents prior to the start of the show.

AWARDS:

- In each breed the first and second place purple award winners from the heifer classes will compete for Junior Champion and Reserve Junior Champion. First and second place purple award winners from the cow classes will compete for Senior Champion and Reserve Senior Champion.
- Junior and Senior Champions and Reserve Junior and Senior Champions of each breed will compete for Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion of their respective breeds.
- Animals must have been awarded a purple ribbon to compete for championships.

SUPREME & RESERVE SUPREME JUNIOR CHAMPIONS

- Youth exhibiting the Saunders County Fair Supreme and Reserve Supreme Junior Champion Dairy Heifers (a female dairy animal that has not had a calf) of all dairy breeds are eligible to compete with their champion heifers in the **Wells Fargo Iowa Supreme Champion Dairy Heifer Scholarship Show** held at the National Cattle Congress in Waterloo, Iowa in September.
- This show is designed for youth from Iowa and all surrounding states (including Nebraska) who receive Supreme and Reserve Supreme Junior Champions at their county fair to come together and meet others with similar interests. The hope is for youth to enjoy their experience, share and learn from one another, and most importantly have FUN!
- Exhibitors must be a member of a 4-H Club or FFA Chapter.
- Exhibitors must be from Iowa or surrounding states (includes Nebraska).
- Last year, the **Wells Fargo Iowa Supreme Champion Dairy Heifer Scholarship Show** awarded \$3,500 in college scholarships to the top three heifers (Supreme, Reserve & Honorable Mention) of the show.
- Upon awarding the Saunders County Fair Supreme and Reserve Supreme Junior Champion Dairy Heifers, the exhibitors will receive certificates and forms to be completed and returned (**by the exhibitor**) to the National Cattle Congress Office in order to be entered in the **Wells Fargo Iowa Supreme Champion Dairy Heifer Scholarship Show**. ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

- An exhibitor must exhibit goats that have been properly identified under their name.
- Officially identified on the Nebraska 4-H Dairy Goat Identification Affidavits AND Official USDA Scrapie Tag needed for commercial breeding and female goats submitted to Extension Office BY JUNE 15th.
- All registered dairy goats must have legible tattoos corresponding with animal ID on Registration papers. Registration papers must accompany goat to the fair.
- LaMancha goats will be identified by drawings or pictures.
- The IDs for all dairy goats will be checked by the superintendent when the animal is brought to fair.
- Final decision as to the class in which an animal will be shown will rest with the show committee.

SCRAPIE TAG (USDA BUREAU OF ANIMAL INDUSTRIES)

GUIDELINE: The USDA Bureau of Animal Industries has mandated a national program to eradicate scrapie in commercial goat herds. Therefore, all female (commercial) goats exhibited at Saunders County Fair will need to have the official USDA identification (scrapie tag).

QUALITY ASSURANCE REQUIREMENT: Nebraska 4-H Program is REQUIRING members (8 - 18 years old) exhibiting DAIRY GOATS to be certified in Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA). This program is mandated by the Nebraska 4-H Program and has been implemented into the Saunders County 4-H Program. Therefore, ALL youth exhibiting DAIRY GOATS at the Saunders County Fair are required to be YQCA certified by June 15 of the current year to be eligible to exhibit.

BEDDING: Exhibitors are responsible for providing their own bedding.

DOG GUIDELINES

In scoring these classes refer to the procedures described in "Nebraska 4-H Dog Show Guidelines 4-H 420". This show will follow standards as set forth in this guide available from the Saunders County Extension office.

FOR ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: Refer to the GENERAL & ANIMAL RULES AND REGULATIONS at the front of this fair exhibitor guide.

ENTRY LIMIT:

- Exhibitors must be enrolled in a 4-H dog project by June 15th of the current year.
- Dogs must be 6 months old or older.
- A 4-H member can be entered in only one showmanship class.
- Two obedience classes can be entered using different dogs and in different level of classes.
- Also, two agility classes can be entered using different dogs and in a different level of class.
- 4-H is a learning-by-doing educational program. Because of this educational goal, it is expected that 4-H members will provide primary care for and training of their dogs and show only that dog unless a substitution is granted by the Superintendent. The dog should reside with the exhibitor or be cared for by the exhibitor the majority of the year.
- Classes will be based on the "Nebraska 4-H Dog Show Rules" (4-H 420).

EXHIBITION:

- Dogs are to be on grounds AND checked in by 12:30 p.m. on the first Sunday of the fair.
- The show will begin promptly at 1:00 p.m.
- This is an unbenchd 4-H dog show, not an AKC show; therefore, the show procedure may not be consistent with all AKC rules. The obedience exercises are designed for the 4-H Program.
- Exhibitors must be ready to enter the ring when their class is called. Promptness is a must.

DRESS CODE: Exhibitors are required to wear blue jeans and a sponsored 4-H t-shirt. Exhibitors are required to wear closed-toed shoes with non-slip soles. No flip flops or sandals are allowed. No hats, caps or other types of headgear are to be worn in the show ring/area. (RESOURCE: Nebraska State Fair 4-H Fair book)

BAITING:

- Baiting with food or toys is not permitted and is cause for disqualification.
- In the showmanship classes, handlers may use a baiting action without food or toys.
- The judge has the authority to disqualify violators.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:

- VACCINATION REQUIRED** – Dogs shall be free of fleas, ticks and ear mites, ringworm, other parasites, and infectious diseases. All dogs must be immunized with current Rabies, Distemper (Hepatitis - Adenovirus, Parvo, and Parainfluenza), where their age permits.
- Copy of vaccination record found here: 4h.unl.edu/documents/sf263.doc
- The certificate of vaccination records must be completed by the exhibitor's veterinarian and submitted to the Extension Office by the July 1st DEADLINE. If immunizations expire between July 1st and 14 days prior to the day of the dog show, please bring current immunization forms to check-in.
- If a dog's immunization expires in the 14 days prior to the day of the dog show, that animal should receive its upcoming immunization at least 14 days before the fair. Immunizations take 14 days to full take effect and no dog will be allowed to exhibit that does not have full immunization coverage.
- Dogs in season will not be allowed in the show.
- Lame or crippled dogs will not be permitted to show if it is determined by a show Superintendent that it is affecting the health of the dog.
- Any dog showing symptoms of poor health or sickness will be asked to leave the arena at the discretion of the 4-H dog superintendent.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

- Exhibitors need to be aware and prepared that each class has a different guideline for appropriate collars and leashes. Refer to the "Nebraska 4-H Dog Show Rules" (4-H 420) for information.
- DOGS NEED TO BE ON LEASH AT ALL TIMES.**
- No dogs are allowed on the Fairgrounds except for the exhibit dogs on Sunday. No dogs allowed in the Livestock barns at ANY TIME.**
- Refer to the Nebraska State 4-H Fair book for all other explanations.

AGGRESSIVE BEHAVIOR: Overly aggressive dogs may be disqualified at the discretion of the judge or superintendent.

SOCIALIZATION: Socialization of dogs not entered in the 4-H Show will not be allowed.

ABUSE: Any abuse of dogs on the ground, or in the ring will result in disqualification. The judge and/or the 4-H dog superintendent have the authority to disqualify violators.

EXHIBITOR RESPONSIBILITY:

Cleanup shall be the exhibitor's responsibility. This includes all areas while on the fairgrounds.

DIV 701 – DOG OBEDIENCE CLASS

Follow rules in Nebraska 4-H Dog Show Guidelines 4-H 420

BEGINNING NOVICE GUIDELINES:

- All exercises must be performed on a six-foot leash.
- Dogs must heel, including figure 8; come on recall; stand for examination; sit stay for one minute, down and stay for 3 minutes with leash on dog. The leash may lay on the floor in front of the dog or be held by the handler.

G701010 Beginning Novice - Division A

This class is for first year handlers and first year dogs only. Dog being shown may not have completed on AKC "leg" toward a "CD" degree. Handlers and dogs may show only one year in Division A. They must advance to Division B.

G701020 Beginning Novice - Division B

Beginning dogs with experienced handlers and dogs that have not earned a purple in Division A or B. Handlers may repeat this class until the dog has earned a purple ribbon or trophy. They then must advance to the next obedience class.

G701030 Novice

Dogs must heel on leash including figure 8; stand for examination off leash; heel free; come on recall off leash, long sit for one minute off leash, and long down for three minutes off leash.

G701040 Graduate Novice

Dogs must heel on leash; stand for examination off leash; heel free; come on recall off leash, long sit for three minutes and long down for five minutes, both with handler out of sight.

G701050 Advanced Graduate Novice

All exercises off leash. Heel free and figure 8; drop on recall; retrieve on flat; retrieve over high jump; broad jump; long sit for three minutes and long down for five minutes, both with handler out of sight.

DIVISION 702 – DOG AGILITY CLASS

- Agility will follow those procedures and classes described in Nebraska 4-H Dog Show Guidelines 4-H 420 to determine class entry.
- Wither heights of all agility dogs must be included with advanced entries.
- Level 1 & 2 agility classes are run on leash.
- Level 3, 4 and 5 are all run off leash.
- One of each obstacle noted in each level are mandatory and duplicate obstacles will be added to make up quantities of obstacles in each level.
- Judges determine the arrangements of the obstacles on the course.
- Obstacles in course should be numbered to note the obstacle order for the course.
- Course maps will be made available and posted at time of show registration in designated area.
- Level 5 youth can use additional equipment for competition that they have access to and can use in practice.
- Agility jump heights – measure dogs at withers to determine jump height:
 - Dogs 11 inches or less: 4 inches
 - Dogs over 11 inches up to and including 14 inches: 8 inches
 - Dogs over 14 inches up to and including 18 inches: 12 inches
 - Dogs over 18 inches: 16 inches

G702010 Level 1

6 obstacles – 3 bar jumps which have two bars each, short dog walk, pause box or table and tunnel (open).

G702020 Level 2

10 obstacles – several bar jumps which have two bars each, short dog walk, pause box or table, tunnel (open), and solid panel jump.

G702030 Level 3

10 obstacles – same obstacles as Level 2 but dogs run off leash for Level 3.

G702040 Level 4

13 obstacles – bar jump which has one bar each, bar jump which has two bars each, tall dog walk, pause box or table, tunnel (open), solid panel jump, teeter totter (seesaw), and weave poles (single set with 6 poles).

G702050 Level 5

15 – 20 obstacles of any of the following such as: bar jump which has one bar each, bar jump which has two bars each, tall dog walk, pause box or table, tunnel (open), solid panel jump, A-frame short, A-frame tall, teeter totter (seesaw), weave poles (single set with 6 poles, weave poles (double set with 12 poles), broad jump, dump jump, triple bar jump, swing bridge, etc. Number of obstacles used for a course will depend on ring size and available equipment at show site. Course layout may include more advanced handling techniques.

DIVISION 703 – DOG RALLY CLASS

Rally will follow those procedures and classes described in Nebraska 4-H Dog Show Guidelines 4-H 420. Refer to Nebraska 4-H Dog Show Guidelines to determine class entry for each level of competition.

SHOW GUIDELINES: The Horse Show will utilize the current “Nebraska 4-H Horse Show and Judging Guide” (4-H 373) as a guide. The guide was **REVISED in 2021**.

HORSE IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

- Please see “4-H & FFA ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION PROCEDURES - SAUNDERS COUNTY” for ID requirements.
- Final decision as to the class in which an animal will be shown will rest with the superintendents.
- No stallions allowed except in Mare & Foal Class
- Any unsportsmanlike conduct by 4-H members, family members, parents or onlookers during the show will be cause for dismissal from the show at the extension office/show manager’s/judge’s discretion.
- Two- and Three-Year-Old Western Pleasure must have Two- and Three-Year-Old affidavit signed and turned in by entry deadline.

LEVEL TEST REQUIREMENTS:

- Exhibitors entering/exhibiting in the Walk-Trot, Showmanship and Halter classes are not required to have passed Level testing.
- Exhibitors are required to have passed Horsemanship Advancement Level I to participate in riding classes other than Walk- Trot, except for the following:
 - Exhibitors are required to have passed Horsemanship Advancement Level II to participate in the Two- & Three-Year-Old Pleasure Horse, Reining, and Hunter Hack.
- Levels Testing:
 - Written tests may be administered by club leader, Extension Office, or if needed, the Tester for the Skills portion of the level testing.
 - SKILLS TESTING (in-hand and ridden) **MUST** be administered by someone on the Approved Levels Tester List, who is certified to test at the Level you are testing for.
 - **Any papers, reports, charts, and demonstrations required by each level must be completed along with written and skills tests and submitted to the Saunders County Extension Office by the set deadline.**

ENTRY/CLASS LIMIT:

- Exhibitors are limited to entering/exhibiting TWO performance horses and TWO horses at halter. An exhibitor with a Two- and Three-Year-Old Pleasure entry will be allowed to exhibit that horse in addition to the TWO performance horse limit.
- Exhibitors are limited to entering an event/class ONCE.
- A single horse may NOT be entered/exhibited in an event/class by more than one person. As an example: George, age 12, cannot ride the same horse in the Pony Pleasure class as Jim, age 10.
- Exhibitors in the Walk/Trot Class(es) may NOT show in any other performance class.
- Classes may be divided or combined within the division at the discretion of the superintendent or show committee.

PREPARATION OF HORSES: Exhibitors are expected to prepare their horses for all events. Family and/or friend assistance is welcomed and expected, BUT lunging and warm up riding on the fairgrounds by persons other than the exhibitor will require immediate and appropriate action by the show superintendent and horse committee.

HORSE HEALTH: Owners are responsible to present healthy animals.

CHAMPION AWARDS: Exhibitors/Horses should receive a purple ribbon to be awarded a championship.

PREMIUMS EARNED: Pick up premiums earned the following day - Wednesday, at the Fairgrounds office, after Noon.

DRESS CODE:

ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

Please see "4-H & FFA ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION PROCEDURES - SAUNDERS COUNTY" for ID requirements.

SCRAPIE TAG (USDA BUREAU OF ANIMAL INDUSTRIES)

GUIDELINE: The USDA Bureau of Animal Industries has mandated a national program to eradicate scrapie in sheep flocks and goat herds. Therefore, all female goats exhibited at Saunders County Fair will need to have the official USDA identification (scrapie tag).

QUALITY ASSURANCE REQUIREMENT: Nebraska 4-H Program is REQUIRING members (8 - 18 years old) exhibiting MEAT GOATS to be certified in Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA). This program is mandated by the Nebraska 4-H Program and has been implemented into the Saunders County 4-H Program. Therefore, ALL youth exhibiting MEAT GOATS at the Saunders County Fair are required to be YQCA certified by June 15 of the current year to be eligible to exhibit.

BEDDING: Exhibitors are responsible for providing their own bedding.

DRESS CODE: Exhibitors are required to wear the sponsored Saunders County 4-H t-shirt. Dark blue jeans and hard-soled shoes or boots are appropriate. No hats, caps or other types of headgear are to be worn while exhibiting. (SOURCE: Nebraska State Fair 4-H Fair book).

Weigh Card/weigh back procedures for market livestock.

Market livestock will follow the weigh card/weigh back system as outlined below.

Families will be responsible for accurately recording exhibitor information, animal identification and weights before turning in cards. Each family will receive a carbon copy card in their exhibitor packet for each animal. Families will fill out this card with animal information, exhibitor information and self-declare their own weights. You will then bring this card to the check-in table. Once cards are turned in, no changes will be allowed. Scales will be available to use.

- Weigh Cards** - Exhibitors will self-declare weights of all market animals (an official weigh-in will not be conducted by show officials). Weigh cards must be completed and turned in during the designated check-in time and location. Animals DO NOT need to be present at the time of turning in their weigh cards. The weight listed on the weigh card will become that animal's official declared weight to be used for assignment to a class and for weigh back purposes.
- Weigh Backs** - A weigh back will be incorporated for all 1st and 2nd place purples in each market class. A 5% variance from the weight declared at check-in will be allowed. Animals not meeting the 5% variance from the declared weight at check-in will be lowered one ribbon group and will not be eligible for any champion awards.

Market animals will not need to be brought to the check-in table. Ear tags will be verified during check-in for your class to verify the correct animal is brought to the correct class. Ear tattoos on breeding beef will be verified during check-in. Ear notches on swine will also be verified. Registered breeding animals will have registration papers verified. Commercial breeding ewes, gilts and meat goat does will self-declare weights. Classes will be divided by weight.

GENERAL RULES:

- All goats must be entered on Tuesday evening at 8:00 p.m.
- Meat goats will be weighed in at the same time as the sheep. The goat committee will then split classes as needed. Does and wethers will be shown in the same weight classes.
- Meat goats are to be under 1 year old. They are to have milk teeth, with no evidence of breaking of the skin or eruption of the two permanent front teeth.
- Bucks are not eligible to show.
- No goat may be shown in both breeding and market class.
- All goats must have horns blunted prior to arrival. Dehorning is acceptable and preferred.**
- There will be a minimum weight of 50 lbs. to sell on auction. Meat goats under 50 lbs. will be shown in FEEDER CLASS.

Grooming Rules:

All livestock shows will be Blow and Go; animals may be clipped, blown, and brushed or combed to enhance their appearance.

Guidelines for the Blow and Go show:

- All animals will be shown free of any adhesive, glue, paint, or powder products.
- Any compounds that have adhesive qualities that when applied cannot be combed or brushed through or alter the color of the animal are forbidden. These products include but are not limited to commonly used adhesives and colorants such as Prime Time, EZ Comb, Tail Adhesive, Natural Hold, Ultra White Touch-Up, Black Touch Up, Black Finisher, black show foam, and baby powder.
- Alcohol, water, oil, foam or any water or alcohol-based products with no adhesives or glue qualities, or artificial colorings are permitted. These products include conditioners and commonly used sprays such as Kleen Sheen, Revive, Final Bloom, Pink Oil, white show foam, Freshen Up, Silk, and Sudden Impact.

4. Any animal found to have prohibited products applied (adhesive, glue, paint, or powder products) will be disqualified from competition. Any premiums (physical or monetary) will be forfeited, and no refunds will be made. All animals will be subject to visual inspection and/or toweling (before and/or after entering the show ring) for the presence of adhesive, glue, paint, or powder products. Toweling of the animal may include, but is not limited to, the topline, legs, chest, belly, flank, and cod/udder areas. If, after inspection, the animal is found to have adhesive, glue, paint, or powder products applied it will be disqualified from competition. Any premiums (physical or monetary) will be forfeited, and no refunds will be made.

Showing & Handling Practices - The use of showing and/or handling practices that may be considered objectionable or abusive, such as striking or slapping goats and exhibiting the goat with its front feet off the ground, are not acceptable. Goats may be braced but will require that all four feet be on the ground. The use of such practices may result in the lowering of a ribbon placing. (Lifting the goat in a fluid motion to set the front legs prior to quickly setting the feet back on the ground is acceptable.)

AUCTION:

- AUCTION DATE: Sunday, August 1 at 1:30 p.m.
- Designation deadline for auction: Saturday, July 31 at 12 Noon.
- FEE: Assessed to 4-H member to defray cost of marketing animals. Fee owed: Beef - \$2/head; Sheep, goats & swine - \$1/head; Pen of broilers - \$.50/pen. Fee owed by Saturday at 12 Noon.
- Each exhibitor is eligible to sell ONE market livestock animal on the Saunders County Fair Livestock Auction. Catch-An-Animal exhibitors are eligible to sell one market livestock animal PLUS one Catch-An-Animal.
- Exhibitors are NOT required to sell an animal, only if they want to and if the sale is conducted in conjunction with the fair.
- Order of sale in the live auction will follow ribbon placings as near as possible. Sale weight will be based on their show weight (weigh in weight).
- Sellers must be present at the time their species is sold or plan for the animal to be brought to the sale ring by another 4-H exhibitor. Those showing up after their species is completed will not be allowed to sell late.
- An Ag Society member will be present at each local locker to verify animal identification upon harvest.
- To be eligible for sale, meat goats must weigh **at least 50 pounds**.

HEALTH RULES: All poultry must be healthy and free of disease. Nebraska currently has pullorum typhoid-free status. In order to maintain the status, the Nebraska Department of Agriculture may be conducting a surveillance test on the Saunders County Fair poultry exhibits sometime during the fair.

BEDDING: Poultry exhibitors will be responsible for bringing their own bedding.

DRESS CODE:

GENERAL INFORMATION:

All Sheep must be identified according to the "4-H & FFA ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION PROCEDURES-SAUNDERS COUNTY" for ID requirements.

SCRAPIE TAG (USDA BUREAU OF ANIMAL INDUSTRIES)

GUIDELINE: The USDA Bureau of Animal Industries has mandated a national program to eradicate scrapie in sheep flocks and goat herds. Therefore, all female sheep exhibited at Saunders County Fair will need to have the official USDA identification (scrapie tag).

QUALITY ASSURANCE REQUIREMENT: Nebraska 4-H Program is REQUIRING members (8 -18 years old) exhibiting SHEEP to be certified in Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA). This program is mandated by the Nebraska 4-H Program and has been implemented into the Saunders County 4-H Program. Therefore, ALL youth exhibiting SHEEP at the Saunders County Fair are required to be QA certified by June 15 of the current year to be eligible to exhibit.

BEDDING: Exhibitors are responsible for providing their own bedding.

DRESS CODE: Exhibitors are required to wear the Saunders County sponsored 4-H t-shirt. Dark blue jeans and hard-soled shoes or boots are appropriate. No hats, caps or other types of headgear are to be worn while exhibiting. (SOURCE: Nebraska State Fair 4-H Fair book)

WEIGH-IN/CHECK-IN:

- Ear tags and identification sheets will be checked at time of check-in.
- Purebred ewes will be classified according to their breeds. Registration papers must be presented at time of check-in

Weigh Card/weigh back procedures for market livestock.

- Market livestock will follow the weigh card/weigh back system as outlined below.
- Families will be responsible for accurately recording exhibitor information, animal identification and weights before turning in cards. Each family will receive a carbon copy card in their exhibitor packet for each animal. Families will fill out this card with animal information, exhibitor information and self-declare their own weights. You will then bring this card to the check-in table. Once cards are turned in, no changes will be allowed. Scales will be available to use.
- Weigh Cards - Exhibitors will self-declare weights of all market animals (an official weigh-in will not be conducted by show officials). Weigh cards must be completed and turned in during the designated check-in time and location. Animals DO NOT need to be present at the time of turning in their weigh cards. The weight listed on the weigh card will become that animal's official declared weight to be used for assignment to a class and for weigh-back purposes.
- Weigh Backs - A weigh back will be incorporated for all 1st and 2nd place purples in each market class. A 5% variance from the weight declared at check-in will be allowed. Animals not meeting the 5% variance from the declared weight at check-in will be lowered one ribbon group and will not be eligible for any champion awards.
- Market animals will not need to be brought to the check-in table. Ear tags will be verified during check-in for your class to verify the correct animal is brought to the correct class. Ear tattoos on breeding beef will be verified during check-in. Ear notches on swine will also be verified. Registered breeding animals will have registration papers verified.
- Commercial breeding ewes, gilts and meat goat does will self-declare weights. Classes will be divided by weight.
- A How-to Video to show you how that system works will be available from the Extension Office.

WOOL LENGTH:

- All market sheep and registered and commercial "meat breed" breeding sheep must be 10 days or less fresh slick shorn before entry and weigh-in at the fair.
- All registered and commercial "wool breed" sheep may be shown in the fleece.

HANDLING PRACTICES: Showing and/or handling practices that may be considered objectionable or abusive, such as striking or slapping lambs and exhibiting the lamb with its feet off the ground are not acceptable. The use of such practices may result in the lowering of a ribbon placing. (Lifting the lamb in a fluid motion to set the front legs prior to quickly setting the feet back on the ground is acceptable.)

Grooming Rules:

All livestock shows will be Blow and Go; animals may be clipped, blown, and brushed or combed to enhance their appearance.

Guidelines for the Blow and Go show:

1. All animals will be shown free of any adhesive, glue, paint, or powder products.
2. Any compounds that have adhesive qualities that when applied cannot be combed or brushed through or alter the color of the animal are forbidden. These products include but are not limited to commonly used adhesives and colorants such as Prime Time, EZ Comb, Tail Adhesive, Natural Hold, Ultra White Touch-Up, Black Touch Up, Black Finisher, black show foam, and baby powder.
3. Alcohol, water, oil, foam or any water or alcohol-based products with no adhesives or glue qualities, or artificial colorings are permitted. These products include conditioners and commonly used sprays such as Kleen Sheen, Revive, Final Bloom, Pink Oil, white show foam, Freshen Up, Silk, and Sudden Impact.
4. Any animal found to have prohibited products applied (adhesive, glue, paint, or powder products) will be disqualified from competition. Any premiums (physical or monetary) will be forfeited, and no refunds will be made. All animals will be subject to visual inspection and/or toweling (before and/or after entering the show ring) for the presence of adhesive, glue, paint, or powder products. Toweling of the animal may include, but is not limited to, the topline, legs, chest, belly, flank, and cod/udder areas. If, after inspection, the animal is found to have adhesive, glue, paint, or powder products applied it will be disqualified from competition. Any premiums (physical or monetary) will be forfeited, and no refunds will be made.

- AUCTION DATE: Sunday, **July 31** at 1:30 p.m.
- Designation deadline for auction: Saturday, **July 30** at 12 noon.
- **FEE:** Assessed to 4-H member to defray cost of marketing animals. Fee owed: Beef - \$2/head; Sheep, goats & swine - \$1/head; Pen of broilers - \$.50/pen. Fee owed by Saturday at 12 Noon.

FOR ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: Refer to the GENERAL & ANIMAL RULES AND REGULATIONS at the front of this fair exhibitor guide.

ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

Please see "4-H & FFA ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION PROCEDURES - SAUNDERS COUNTY" for ID requirements. All swine will be required to have ear notches AND official 4-H/FFA EID tag.

- Ear notches and ear tags for all Swine will be checked by superintendents at 8:00 pm on Tuesday, JULY 27. Please have stall cards in place by that time.
- Pigs with ear notches and ear tags that do not match the Ownership Affidavit will be allowed to show but will be dropped one ribbon color and will not be eligible for medals or Champion awards.
- Swine with fresh ear notches will not be allowed to show.

QUALITY ASSURANCE REQUIREMENT: Nebraska 4-H Program is REQUIRING members (8 -18 years old) exhibiting SWINE to be certified in Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA). This program is mandated by the Nebraska 4-H Program and has been implemented into the Saunders County 4-H Program. Therefore, ALL youth exhibiting SWINE at the Saunders County Fair are required to be YQCA certified by June 15 of the current year to be eligible to exhibit.

BEDDING: Exhibitors are responsible for providing their own bedding.

DRESS CODE: Exhibitors are required to wear sponsored 4-H t-shirt. Dark blue jeans and hard-soled shoes or boots are appropriate. No hats, caps or other types of headgear are to be worn while exhibiting. (SOURCE: Nebraska State Fair 4-H Fair book)

WEIGH-IN/CHECK-IN:

Weigh Card/weigh back procedures for market livestock.

- Market livestock will follow the weigh card/weigh back system as outlined below.

- Families will be responsible for accurately recording exhibitor information, animal identification and weights before turning in cards. Each family will receive a carbon copy card in their exhibitor packet for each animal. Families will fill out this card with animal information, exhibitor information and self-declare their own weights. You will then bring this card to the check-in table. Once cards are turned in, no changes will be allowed. Scales will be available to use.
- Weigh Cards - Exhibitors will self-declare weights of all market animals (an official weigh-in will not be conducted by show officials). Weigh cards must be completed and turned in during the designated check-in time and location. Animals DO NOT need to be present at the time of turning in their weigh cards. The weight listed on the weigh card will become that animal's official declared weight to be used for assignment to a class and for weigh-back purposes.
- Weigh Backs - A weigh back will be incorporated for all 1st and 2nd place purples in each market class. A 5% variance from the weight declared at check-in will be allowed. Animals not meeting the 5% variance from the declared weight at check-in will be lowered one ribbon group and will not be eligible for any champion awards.
- Market animals will not need to be brought to the check-in table. Ear tags will be verified during check-in for your class to verify the correct animal is brought to the correct class. Ear tattoos on breeding beef will be verified during check in. Ear notches on swine will also be verified. Registered breeding animals will have registration papers verified.
- Commercial breeding ewes, gilts and meat goat does will self-declare weights. Classes will be divided by weight.
- A How-to Video to show you how that system works will be available from the Extension Office.
- All Swine exhibits must be in place by 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday of the fair. Ear notches and ear tags for all Swine will be checked by superintendents at this time. Failure to have swine in place by this time will result in lowering one ribbon placing.
