### DIAMOND CLOVER AWARD APPLICATION

All 4-H'ers are invited to fill out an application for the Diamond Clover Awards program. It truly is an achievable goal-setting and application process.

There are six levels. Youth can start at the beginning or at the age level associated with the award. For each level, there is a list of possible accomplishments from which 4-H youth choose their goals. The accomplishments increase in quantity and difficulty for each level. At the beginning of the 4-H year, participants plan what to accomplish and at the end of the 4-H year, they report on their completed accomplishments. In Seward County, goal sheets are due April 1 and reports are due October 1. Successful completion of a level's Plan & Report form results in a 4-H youth earning that level of the Diamond Clover program. In Seward County youth receive a pin, a certificate, and a prize. ### **SPEECH CONTEST**

### Age Categories, Time Limits, Topics:

- Clover Kid (ages 5-7 on Jan. 1,2023): 3 minutes or less. Talk about anything! You may read a poem, a favorite story or do the 4-H Pledge.
- Novice(ages 8-9 on Jan. 1, 2023): 3 minutes or less. Talk about anything! You may read a poem or a favorite story. Should only be 1st or 2nd year speakers.
- Junior (ages 8-9 on Jan. 1, 2023): 1-3 minutes. Must be an original speech relating to 4-H.
- Intermediate (ages 10-13 on Jan. 1, 2023): 3-5 minutes. Must be an original speech relating to 4-H. (State Event Qualifier)
- Senior (ages 14-18 on Jan. 1, 2023): 5-8 minutes. Must be an original speech relating to 4-H. (State Event Qualifier)

### **Contest Guidelines:**

- All speeches must be original and include 4-H as the major component of the speech.
  - Many speakers in the Public Speaking Contest have given speeches in other contests. This is fine; however, previous speeches may not
    be used verbatim for the 4-H contest. It is okay to use the same ideas from a speech previously delivered in competition, but it must be 4-H
    related. Enough changes should be made to make that speech new to the speaker and the audience. 4-H public speakers may not use an
    old speech written by a sibling, other 4-H members or anyone else.
  - Acknowledge the source of information used in the speech. For example, an article from a magazine may be used for reference but should not be quoted directly unless you tell the audience your source.
- Organization: Introduction, body and conclusion.
  - Use of visual aids and props are not allowed. Notes may be used for Clover Kid & Novice categories.
- Delivery: Eye contact, timing, gestures and posture.
- Voice: Clear tones, correct volume and good pronunciation.
  - Dress appropriately. Do not wear costumes or special effect clothing. 4-H Chevron required.
- No team speeches are allowed.
  - 4-H'ers who are 10 years old and older as of Jan. 1, 2023 will be eligible for Premier Communication Event (State Contest). Youth must be selected at County Contest to compete in the Premier Communication Event.

### **PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT (PSA) CONTEST**

### Age Categories, Time Limits, Topics:

- Clover Kid (ages 5-7 on Jan. 1, 2023): 3 minutes or less
- Novice (ages 8-9 on Jan. 1, 2023): 3 minutes or less. 1st or 2nd year speakers.
- Junior (ages 8-9 on Jan. 1, 2023): 1-3 minutes.
- Intermediate (ages 10-13 on Jan. 1, 2023): 3-5 minutes. (State Event Qualifier)
- Senior (ages 14-18 on Jan. 1, 2023): 5-8 minutes. (State Event Qualifier)

### **Contest Guidelines:**

- All PSA's are 60 seconds in length.
- The state theme for the 2023 Public Service Announcement is "Discover Your Spark in Nebraska 4-H" and should be incorporated in the PSA.
  - o All radio PSA's must promote 4-H and be general enough to be used anywhere in Nebraska at anytime of the year.
- All 4-H PSA's must include the following tag line within the last ten seconds of the PSA: "Learn more about the Nebraska Extension 4-H
  Youth Development Program at 4h.unl.edu." The tag line is included in the 60 second time limit.
- Sound effects and public domain music may be used. Copyrighted material may not be used.
- All PSA's must be the original work of the presenter. contestants may not use PSA's written and provided by the state or national staff.
- No team PSA's are allowed.
- Scoring is based on the content of the material and delivery.
- Appearance and gestures are not judged.
  - County Contest Only: Participants may read their PSA at the contest or submit a flash/jump drive to be played at the contest.
- If selected to go onto Premier Communication Event (State Contest), radio PSA's will be submitted electronically as a .wav or .mp3 audio format. No CDs accepted.

### Categories:

### Show 'n Tell (County Only)

- Description: A live presentation with a formal talk where youth will use visual aids (such as props, posters, computer-based visuals, handouts, video, etc.) to show and tell others how to do something.
- · Age: Clover Kids Only
- Time Limit: up to 5 minutes individual, no team presentations

### Illustrated Presentation (Premier Communication Event Eligible)

- Description: An illustrated Presentation involves one or two 4-H'ers giving a live presentation with a formal talk where the presenter(s) will use visual aids (such as props, posters, computer-based visuals, handouts, video, etc.) to show and tell others how to do something. All presentation topics should be related to what the 4-H youth is learning through 4-H educational experiences.
- Age: 9-18 as of Jan. 1, 2023
- Time Limit: 6-8 minutes individual, 8-10 minutes team

### **Contest Guidelines:**

- All 4-H Presentations should be related to how the 4-H youth is learning about through their 4-H education experiences, focused on the priorities of college and career readiness, community development, and STEM (science, technology, engineering and math).
- Presentations must include an introduction, a body, and a conclusion.
- Each participant is required to wear the 4-H chevron, 4-H emblem or 4-H shirt.
- All categories require the presence of the contestant.
- · The judge views the entire presentation and engages in a question-answer session following the presentation.
- 4-H'ers who are 10 years old and older as of Jan. 1, 2023 will be eligible for Premier Communication Event (State Contest). Youth must be selected at County Contest to compete in Premier Communication Event.

### **VIDEO COMMUNICATION CONTEST**

### **Video Communication (Premier Communication Event Eligible)**

- Description: The video communication contest allows youth to create a multi-media video around a theme related to 4-H. Judges will be evaluating on both the organization of information as well as the audio and video production.
- Age: 9-18 as of Jan. 1, 2023
- Time Limit: 60-90 seconds individual only

### **Contest Guidelines:**

- · Youth may use a phone, laptop or tablet to create a multi-media piece around the theme: "Discover Your Spark in Nebraska 4-H!"
- Sound effects, public-domain music, and graphics can be used. Copyrighted materials may not be used.
- For county contest only, the 4-H'er must be present to play video. If selected to go onto Premier Communication Event (State Contest), the video will be electronically submitted as MP4 files.

### **REMINDER: LATE FEE POLICY**

In 2019, 4-H Council enacted a late fee of \$15 per member for those that are late with animal ID sheets and county fair pre-entry. Identification forms and /or entries may be submitted up to 7 days past the specified due date (County Fair Only) and are subject to this late fee. ID Forms and entries will not be excepted after this 7 day period. If you are late with ID forms for District, State horse show and State Fair Livestock, you will be ineligible to exhibit.





### **Livestock Information for Clover Kids**

Please review the rules concerning the Clover Kids Livestock showmanship class. Nothing is new, however, rules will be enforced for the 2023 Seward County Fair.

- Clover Kid Showmanship Class Pre-fair entry is required.
- Clover Kid must ID animal with own Animal ID sheet or include their name on the ID sheet of the animal owned by another 4-H/FFA exhibitor.
- Each member may bring one animal (or use another 4-H/FFA member's animal) in this division to the county fair.
- The animal may be stalled during the fair or be brought the day of the show.
- If exhibiting their own animal, a stall will be needed and must be indicated on 4-Her's entry form.
- The animal needs to be an animal the youth has cared for.
- · An adult is required to be with the Clover Kid when working with or showing their animal.
- The Clover Kid will lead the animal in the show ring or be placed in a holding pen (according to the superintendent's discretion).
- The youth will discuss their knowledge of care and raising of the animal with the official.
- Age, size and temperament of the animal project must be appropriate for the exhibitor's age and size.

### Rules that must be followed include:

- The show will be non-competitive.
- There will be one adult/teen volunteer per Clover Kid assisting when the animal is being handled.
- The animal must be 6 months of age or younger the day of show.
- The animal must be less than 350 pounds the day of the show.



All livestock, rabbit, and poultry exhibitors: read entire contents to be sure you know how to complete your YQCA Certification.

All livestock, rabbit, and poultry exhibitors must pass YQCA yearly to be eligible to exhibit at the Seward County Fair and NE State Fair shows. Youth may enroll in online classes or attend a trainer-led class. Please contact Cindy at the Extension Office if you have any questions.



Breeding Heifer Champions will be selected as each breed is shown. Supreme Heifer will be selected at the conclusion of the Breeding Heifer show.

- Take care of your animal at the county fair with your mentor.
- Enter your journal as an exhibit at the county fair and participate in an interview

Enrollment in 4-H Partners will be based on availability of mentors. The first to sign up will be matched with a mentor first.

If a mentor is not available, the fee will be returned.
