4-H EMAILS COME FROM "RegMax"

All 4-H'ers are invited to fill out an application for the Diamond Clover Awards program. It truly is an achievable goal-setting and application process.

There are six levels. Youth can start at the beginning or at the age level associated with the award. For each level, there is a list of possible accomplishments from which 4-H youth choose their goals. The accomplishments increase in quantity and difficulty for each level. At the beginning of the 4-H year, participants plan what to accomplish and at the end of the 4-H year, they report on their completed accomplishments. In Seward County, goal sheets are due May 1 and reports are due October 1. Successful completion of a level's Plan & Report form results in a 4-H youth earning that level of the Diamond Clover program. In Seward County youth receive a pin, a certificate, and a prize. These are awarded at the annual 4-H Achievement Party. More information on the Diamond Clover Program is at: https://4h.unl.edu/diamond-clover

Attention Families that Plan to Show Rabbits!

4-H staff and Small Animal superintendents have made the decision to no longer supply and feed rabbits at the fair. This will now become the responsibility of the individual 4-H'er and their family to supply and feed their rabbits.

Additionally, to mirror State Fair rules, we are no longer requiring a rabbit ID sheet to be filled out and turned in to the office. Ear tattoos will still be required.

Breakaway roping only if we have 5 or more exhibitors. There will be a cattle charge due at time of the roping.


There will not be any Heading or Healing live roping.

2024 TRACTOR & EQUIPMENT SAFETY TRAINING

MARK YOUR CALENDAR! COST: \$40

Federal law prohibits children under 16 years of age from using certain equipment on a farm unless their parents or legal guardians own the farm. However, certification received through this course grants an exemption to the law allowing 14- and 15-year-olds to drive a tractor and to do field work with certain mechanized equipment. Certification is earned by completing a Hands-On Safety Day with written test (Certification Day 1), then completing the Tractor and Equipment Safety Training with driving exam (Certification Day 2). Successful completion of a Certification Days 1 and 2 will result in certification for 14 and 15 year old youth to be employed on farms and ranches.

Youth <u>under 14 years</u> of age can attend Certification Day 1 **if accompanied by an adult**. They will not be able to drive equipment, attend Day 2, or become certified. Students under 14 must still register, but will not be charged the registration fee.

Livestock Information for Clover Kids

Please review the rules concerning the Clover Kids Livestock showmanship class. Nothing is new, however, rules will be enforced for the 2024 Seward County Fair.

- Clover Kid Showmanship Class Pre-fair entry is required.
- Clover Kid must ID animal with own Animal ID sheet or include their name on the ID sheet of the animal owned by another 4-H exhibitor.
- Each member may bring one animal (or use another 4-H member's animal) in this division to the county fair.
- The animal may be stalled during the fair or be brought the day of the show.
- If exhibiting their own animal, a stall will be needed and must be indicated on 4-Her's entry form.
- The animal needs to be an animal the youth has cared for.
- An adult is required to be with the Clover Kid when working with or showing their animal.
- The Clover Kid will lead the animal in the show ring or be placed in a holding pen (according to the superintendent's discretion).
- The youth will discuss their knowledge of care and raising of the animal with the official.
- Age, size and temperament of the animal project must be appropriate for the exhibitor's age and size.

Rules that must be followed include:

- The show will be non-competitive.
- There will be one adult volunteer per Clover Kid assisting when the animal is being handled.
- The animal must be 6 months of age or younger the day of show.
- The animal must be less than 350 pounds the day of the show.

A. Breeding Heifers

All registered heifers will show in their respective breed class. Heifers without papers will show in the commercial breed class. Classes are divided as follows:

- 1. January February
- 2. March April
- 3. May June
- 4. July August
- 5. September October
- 6. November December

Breeding Heifer Champions will be selected as each breed is shown. Supreme Heifer will be selected at the conclusion of the Breeding Heifer show.

- B. Senior Showmanship (16-21 years of age on January 1)
- C. Intermediate Showmanship (12-15 years of age on January 1)
- D. Junior Showmanship (8-11 years of age on January 1)

Showmanship exhibitors must use animals entered in their own name at this show.

- E. Market Heifers
 - 1. Shown by weight
 - 2. Selection of Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Heifer
- F. Market Steers
 - 1. Shown by weight
 - 2. Selection of Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Steer
 - 3. Selection of Overall Champion Market Beef
