State Fair Exhibitor Age Changed

In 2023, Nebraska 4-H lowered the age limit for participation in the Nebraska State Fair for all inperson events to nine years of age. That change increased the participation and provided more youth the opportunity to have an engaging learning experience.

Due to positive feedback from the previous year, the decision has been made to change the age of eligibility in 2024 to be 8 years of age before January 1 (of the current year) for all inperson State Fair events (livestock, contests, fashion shows, contests) and other state competitions (Fonner Park State 4-H Horse Expo, PASE, communications contest). Note: there will be some events that will maintain their ages due to specific program rules (shooting sports). Please check information on each specific event as it becomes available.

4-H'er Opportunities



We are excited to announce the fourth year of the Nebraska 4-H Livestock Achievement Program. This additional opportunity for enrolled livestock project youth, is designed to promote all educational aspects of 4-H livestock projects including selection, production, leadership, and exhibition by recognizing youth striving to improve in their livestock project knowledge and leadership.

The program recognizes Members of Excellence across all 4-H livestock project areas, including: beef, sheep, meat goat, swine, dairy cattle, dairy goat, rabbit, and poultry.

The program consists of three levels that require 4-H members to plan and report a broad range of age-appropriate and project-related accomplishments. For each level, the Livestock Achievement Program provides a list of accomplishments from which 4-H members choose their goals. Each accomplishment is worth a specific number of points. Junior 8-9 submits pictures, poster, presentation, and other learning activities to receive the distinction of Junior Member of Excellence, no point value, Intermediates, ages 10-13, must complete 100 points worth of activities to receive the distinction of Intermediate Member of Excellence. Seniors, ages 14-18, must complete 150 points worth of activities to receive the distinction of Senior Member of Excellence. The Plan and Reports, linked on the webpage, show examples of the project related accomplishments they can choose, or they can identify their own with approval of their local educator.

Applications/Sign up are due June 15th through the application form link on the website. Plan and Reports, as well as Project Records will be due August 1 via the completion form on the website.

Youth completing the achievement program and receiving member of excellence recognition in the various species will be recognized during the Parade of Champions, 4-H weekend at the Nebraska State Fair.

Livestock Info

Clover Kid Livestock Information for 2024

Please review the rules concerning the Clover Kids livestock showmanship class.

- Clover Kid Showmanship Class pre-fair entry is required.
- Clover Kid must ID animal with own Animal ID sheet or include their name on the ID sheet of the animal owned by another 4-H/FFA exhibitor.
- Each member may bring one animal (or use another 4-H/FFA member's animal) in this division to the county fair.
- Animal must be ID'd in Seward County 4-H.
- The animal may be stalled during the fair or be brought the day of the show.
- If exhibiting their own animal, a stall will be needed and must be indicated on 4-H'ers entry form.
- The animal needs to be an animal the youth has cared for.
- An adult is required to be with the Clover Kid when working with or showing their animal.
- The Clover Kid will lead the animal in the show ring or be placed in a holding pen (according to the superintendent's discretion).
- The youth will discuss their knowledge of care and raising of the animal with the official.
- Age, size, and temperament of the animal project must be appropriate for the exhibitor's age and size.

Rules that must be followed include:

- The show will be non-competitive.
- There will be one adult/teen volunteer per Clover Kid assisting when the animal is being handled.
- The animal must be 6 months of age or younger the day of show.
- The animal must be less than 350 pounds the day of the show.

How to complete your Instructor - Led training registration:

- 1.4-H members need to be enrolled in 4-H for 2024 before you can register for YQCA.

- 2. Create a YQCA account if you do not have one. Remember your password! See Attatched PDF
- 3. Once you have created a YQCA account, register for the training and pay online (\$3/youth) at: https://gcaprogram.org.

 - b. First choose your age group
 - c. Choose 'Instructor Led" training for the date you want to attend.
 - d. Choose Seward County
 - e. Follow the screen prompts for payment information.

Instructor Led Training Cost \$6.00/youth \$3.00/youth at online registration + \$3.00/youth collected at the time of the training.

How to complete your Web-Based training registration:

YQCA certificate of completion must be printed and mailed or brought into the Extension Office, or a PDF file emailed to cwolverton3@unl.edu. No phone screenshots will be accepted.



All livestock, rabbit, and poultry exhibitors: read entire contents to be sure you know how to complete your YQCA Certification.

All livestock, rabbit, and poultry exhibitors must pass YQCA yearly to be eligible to exhibit at the Seward County Fair and NE State Fair shows. Youth may enroll in online classes or attend a trainer-led class. Please contact Cindy at the Extension Office if you have any questions.

- 1. Go to www.yqcaprogram.org
- 2. Log into your existing Account or:
- 3. Create a new YQCA account. You can now create a family account and pay for your family at one time.
- 4. Complete registration information for the owner of the account.

a. Remember your Username and Password

- 5. Validate your account registration.
- 6. Once an account has been created then you can add more than one child. Select Add Child.
- 7. Complete the registration for your child. Select "submit" to move on or "Submit and Add Another Child" to add additional children.
- 8. Complete "Data sharing Consent" to verify their certification with the listed third parties.
- 9. View the child dashboard to edit child profiles, you can add and delete youth here.
- 10. For online and trainer led trainings youth must complete a pre and post test prior to gaining access to their YQCA Certificate of Completion.

Printing your Certification

- 1. Log into your account.
- 2. Be sure you have completed the pre and posttest.
- 3. Access your certificate using the dropdown menu under "Course Certificates." Select the "+" to see dropdown on completed courses.
- 4. Select the blue button to download certificate.
- 5. Print the certificate or save it to your device.
- 6. Make sure the Extension Office has a copy of your certificate of completion by June 15th.
 - a. Print and drop off a copy your Certificate of Completion to the Extension Office or
 - b. Email a PDF of the YQCA Certificate of Completion to cwolverton3@unl.edu.
