

## In 2019, 4-H Council enacted a late fee of \$15 per member for those who are late with animal ID sheets and county fair pre-entry. Identification forms and/or entries may be submitted up to 7 days past the specified due date (County Fair only) and are subject to this late fee. ID FORMS AND ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AFTER THIS 7 DAY PERIOD. If you are late with identification forms for Horse District/State show and Livestock State Fair, you will be ineligible to exhibit.

· Vice President: Courtney Kossow


• Secretary: Ella Kossow

### **Thriving in 4-H**

Why do we have 4-H? What are 4-H experiences intended to accomplish? The goal of the 4-H program is to provide a positive youth development experience for our youth so that young people may eventually achieve success in their chosen profession or vocation, contribute to their communities, and experience happiness and well-being.

Over the last several years the 4-H Thriving Model has been developed to illustrate the components of high-quality youth development programs.

At the base of the model is the soil or the context. Ideally 4-H programs:

- Provide a place for youth to explore and engage with their interests and passions their sparks!
- Foster positive relationships with youth and adults.
- Provide a place where youth belong and matter.

Over the next year, we will explore the 4-H Thriving Model and how all of us (youth, parents & caring adults, volunteers) can create positive developmental experiences for youth.

### Diamond Clover Awards Program - Achievable for all 4-H'ers

All 4-H'ers are invited to fill out an application for the Diamond Clover Awards program. It truly is an achievable goal-setting and application process.

There are six levels. Youth can start at the beginning or at the age level associated with the award. For each level, there is a list of possible accomplishments from which 4-H youth choose their goals. The accomplishments increase in quantity and difficulty for each level. At the beginning of the 4-H year, participants plan what to accomplish and at the end of the 4-H year, they report on their completed accomplishments. In Seward County, goal sheets are due April 1 and reports are due October 1. Successful completion of a level's Plan & Report form results in a 4-H youth earning that level of the Diamond Clover program. In Seward County youth receive a pin, a certificate, and a prize. ### Membership Options for 4-H include Independent Membership

As you evaluate your membership needs for 2024, the following are options for enrolling in the 4-H program in Seward County.


- 1) 4-H Clubs an organized group of at least five youth from three different families who meet regularly with adult volunteers or 4-H staff. The purpose of a 4-H club is to provide positive youth development and foster educational opportunities to meet the needs of young people.
- 2) Independent Membership is now available as a membership option in Seward County. Families and independent members may participate in planned learning that occurs independently of a formal group setting. This may be an individual, paired, or family learning effort. While 4-H encourages participation in club settings to promote friendship and interaction with other youth and adults, for some youth, this is not always possible. Families and independent members are welcome to participate in the 4-H experience.

4-H membership is open to all youth between the ages of 8 and 18 as of January 1 of the current year. Youth ages 5 to 7 may also participate as Clover Kids. Members are required to officially enroll in 4-H annually.

Many youth participate in 4-H through other experiences including camps, school enrichment, afterschool clubs and programs, and special interest programs (workshops, daycamps, clinics). If you have questions on these membership options, please contact us.

### **Livestock Clover Kids Information**

Please review the rules concerning the Clover Kids Livestock showmanship class. Nothing is new, however, rules will be enforced for the 2024 Seward County Fair.

Clover Kid Showmanship Class Pre-fair entry is required.

- Clover Kid must ID animal with own Animal ID sheet or include their name on the ID sheet of the animal owned by another 4-H/FFA exhibitor.
- Each member may bring one animal (or use another 4-H/FFA member's animal) in this division to the county fair.
- The animal may be stalled during the fair or be brought the day of the show.
- If exhibiting their own animal, a stall will be needed and must be indicated on 4-Her's entry form.
- The animal needs to be an animal the youth has cared for.
- An adult is required to be with the Clover Kid when working with or showing their animal.
- The Clover Kid will lead the animal in the show ring or be placed in a holding pen (according to the superintendent's discretion).
- The youth will discuss their knowledge of care and raising of the animal with the official.
- Age, size, and temperament of the animal project must be appropriate for the exhibitor's age and size.

### Rules that must be followed include:

- The show will be non-competitive.
- There will be one adult/teen volunteer per Clover Kid assisting when the animal is being handled.
- The animal must be 6 months of age or younger the day of show.
- The animal must be less than <u>350 pounds the day of the show.</u>

# What Will I do as a 4-H Partner?

- Attend orientation on April 25 at 6:00 p.m.
- Make regular (minimum of 6) visits to your mentor's farm, do chores, and help take care of the animal and learn from your mentor.
- Attend a workshop or a field trip.
- out to your mentor's farm. Complete assignments and keep a journal about what you learn each time you go
- Enter and bring your animal to the county fair and participate in showmanship
- Take care of your animal at the county fair with your mentor
- Enter your journal as an exhibit at the county fair and participate in an interview

Enrollment in 4-H Partners will be based on availability of mentors. The first to sign up will be matched with a mentor first.

If a mentor is not available, the fee will be returned.

### All livestock, rabbit, and poultry exhibitors: read entire contents to be sure you know how to complete your YQCA Certification.

All livestock, rabbit, and poultry exhibitors must pass YQCA yearly to be eligible to exhibit at the Seward County Fair and NE State Fair shows. Youth may enroll in online classes or attend a trainer-led class. Please contact Cindy at the Extension Office if you have any questions.

- 10. For online and trainer led trainings youth must complete a pre and post test prior to gaining access to their YQCA Certificate of Completion.
