
Club Contest for Fair-Scavenger Hunt!

Thriving in 4-H--Helping Youth Explore their Sparks

In 4-H, you may hear us talk about providing a place where youth can explore their spark. What is a "spark"? Youth sparks are a key element to thriving. A spark is an interest, but it's more than that. A spark leads to actions that can benefit a young person. Sparks provide energy, joy, purpose, and direction in one's life. A spark can help a young person connect with others with similar interests.

Sparks can also help prevent young people from trouble because they provide something positive to focus on and can provide motivation to succeed.

In 4-H, there are numerous possibilities for youth to explore their sparks, whether it's projects, leadership, service, or a cause.

How can you help youth identify their spark?

- Watch for the moments when you see the light bulb go off. Discuss these with youth.
- Ask questions, listen, provide encouragement.
- Model your own sparks so youth can see your passion and excitement.
- Identify opportunities for youth to express their sparks. Help them find ways to explore their interests even further

Volunteers, caring adults or teens, parents and family members can all become Spark Champions by supporting youth as they focus on something that brings them joy and provides motivation to grow and learn.

4-H Horse Show Walk-Trot Exhibitors

Walk-Trot classes:

- Are for youth who are not ready to enter classes requiring or assuming a lope.
- Walk-Trot exhibitors may enter walk-trot classes, showmanship and halter classes only.
- NEW: Walk-trot exhibitors may exhibit as a walk-trot exhibitor for 2 consecutive years.





NEW 4-H ROPING FOR THE 2024 SEWARD COUNTY FAIR HORSE SHOW

Breakway

- Must have at least 5 entries
- Cattle fees will be collected at the event. Dummy Roping
 - Exhibitors will rope a fake calf pulled behind a 4-wheeler.
- Ground Roping
 - No horse, exhibitors will stand behind a line and rope a dummy calf.

Rules will be available on the Seward County 4-H web site and at the Seward County Extension Office More information will be provided in the prefair entry mailing.



Small Animal Updates for 2024

4-H staff and Small Animal superintendents have made the decision to no longer supply and feed rabbits at the fair. This will now become the responsibility of the individual 4-H'er and their family to supply and feed their rabbits.

Additionally, to mirror State Fair rules, we are no longer requiring a rabbit ID sheet to be filled out and turned in to the office. Ear tattoos will still be required.
