Applications due October 10

- <u>Annual Achievement Application</u> this is your record book for the year. Turning in your Achievement
 Application marks the completion of your 4-H year and makes you eligible to receive year pins, scholarships
 and other awards.
- <u>Clover Kid Record Books</u> Clover Kids turn in this form instead of the Achievement Application. This is their record for the year.

County and Special Awards

4-H'ers are encouraged to apply for awards. Submit the following applications to earn recognition for what you have learned and done in your years of 4-H.

- County Awards Application awards based on growth in projects, learning experiences, leadership, and service. Earn project pins.
- Chris Clover Application points award based on overall involvement in 4-H.
- Tim Sheehan Memorial Award points award based on involvement in livestock projects and 4-H.
- Bev Waegli Outstanding FCS 4-H'er points award based on involvement in FCS projects and 4-H.

All applications will be accepted through October 10.

4-H'er Opportunities

Consider Running for 4-H Council

You can get involved in setting the direction for the local 4-H program by serving on the Seward County 4-H Council. Both youth and adults are asked to consider being on the ballot this fall. Council members plan the yearly programs, promote 4-H, help set local 4-H policy, and secure funds for programming.

Positions up for election/re-election for the 2023-2024 year include:

- District 4 Adult (Milford/Pleasant Dale area) (current Council member is eligible for re-election for one more term)
- District 3 Adult (Utica, Beaver Crossing, Goehner, Cordova)
- District 3 Youth (Utica, Beaver Crossing, Goehner, Cordova)
- District 2 Youth (City of Seward and just beyond)
- Adult At Large (anywhere in Seward County)
- Youth At Large (anywhere in Seward County)

Council members:

- Attend Council meetings and participate in the activities.
- Become acquainted with the 4-H youth programs and plan methods in which 4-H can best serve youth.
- Look for communities/groups of individuals not being served, and help establish 4-H with those groups.
- Inform businesses, organizations and individuals on the benefits of the 4-H Youth Development program.
- Attend a minimum of 4 various 4-H and youth functions to evaluate the benefits and results. This will not include 4-H club meetings.
- Serve on program committees, such as trophy and awards and food stand, as well as serving on work groups or task forces as needed.

All the district representatives serve a two-year term. Members are limited to two consecutive two-year terms.

At-large members serve a one-year term and can be re-elected for up to three years in a row.


