Completing the application

- **To apply for County Awards:** Application may be emailed to: Stanton-county@unl.edu or paper copy submitted to: Stanton County Extension, 302 6th St., Stanton, NE 68779.
- Limit responses in the “My Experiences” section to a maximum of 3 pages – Junior or 4 pages - Senior, single-spaced, 12-point font.
- In the selection process, significant accomplishments in your **4-H experience, leadership, community involvement and career spark** are given more consideration than the number of 4-H projects completed.

County Level Awards

Age divisions for awards:

Junior – 8-10

Intermediate – 11-13

Senior – 14-18

Awards will be selected for the following categories:

- Agriculture
- STEM
- Leadership and Entrepreneurship
- Healthy Living
- College and Career Preparation for My Future

Winner in each category will receive \$50. 4-H'er may win each category once per age division.

Application has to be worthy to win in order to be selected. It will be the judge's prerogative to determine if an application is worthy or not.

Please submit the following items via email (or paper copy) to Stanton County by November 10.

Senior Applicants (ages 15-19) need to mark if they are applying for State and/or National Awards in addition to a County Award. Designate BOTH Awards applying for and the Program Area in which you are applying. If applying for State and National Awards be sure to read and submit all additional information.
