HITCHCOCK COUNTY OPEN CLASS

GENERAL RULES

- 1. Exhibitors must be a resident of Hitchcock County or adjoining townships.
- 2. All articles must be the work of the exhibitor and must have been completed by the exhibitor within the current year.
- 3. Exhibits must NOT have been exhibited at any other County Fair or during any previous year at any County Fair.
- 4. Exhibitors may enter ONLY ONE exhibit per judging class per person (except where listed otherwise).
- 5. Non-perishable entries (Needlework and Crafts, Artwork and Photography, Food Preservation and Under 8) should be entered on Wednesday, July 17, 2024 from 4:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.
- 6. Perishable entries (Horticulture and Foods) should be entered on Thursday, July 18, 2024 from 9 a.m. to Noon.
- 7. Exhibits will be released on Saturday, July 20, 2024 from 7:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. Premium money must be signed for at this time.
- All open class premium money will be pro-rated if the dollar amount budgeted for Open Class Premiums is exceeded. If it is determined premiums need to be reduced, it will be done on a percentage basis of all open class premiums awarded for the current Hitchcock County Fair.
- 9. Entries and premium money must be picked up between 7:00 and 8:00 p.m. on Saturday, July 20, 2024 or the premium will be forfeited back into the premium account.
- 10. Livestock shown in FFA or 4-H Departments are ineligible for Open Class competition, with the exception of exhibitors not yet eligible for 4-H showing in the Open Class showmanship divisions.
- 11. All livestock, with the exception of poultry and rabbits, must have a showman to be eligible for premiums.
- 12. All Open Class livestock exhibitors must contact the Extension Office 1 week before Fair to enter their exhibits.
- 13. All livestock including rabbits and poultry will be entered and released the day of the show.
- 14. Any diseased, crippled or unworthy animals will not be eligible to exhibit and will be returned to the owner.

DIVISION E – POULTRY

GENERAL RULES

- HEALTH REQUIREMENTS: Health certificate not required for poultry. A State
 Veterinarian many test your birds for diseases during the Fair. This will be of no
 charge to you. In order to comply with the Nebraska Poultry Disease Act, poultry
 exhibited are required to meet the following qualifications: 1. Must be free
 from lice and mites. 2. Must be in good health condition and clean. Dirty or
 diseased birds will be disqualified and removed from the poultry show.
- BREEDS: To be eligible for bred exhibition, cockerel, pullet, cock or hen chicken entries must be fair representatives of one of the breeds listed in the American Standard of Perfection.
- MINIMUM WEIGHTS: The minimum weights for exhibition birds will be as stated in the American Standard of Perfection and the Bantam Standard.
- TRIO: A pen of egg production birds can be hybrids, crossbred or purebred and shall consist of 3 sexually mature females. Egg production females will be judged for

- RULES FOR BANTAM & OTHER POULTRY: The rules for standard size chickens apply equally to bantams, waterfowl and turkey where applicable.
- NUMBER OF ENTRIES: There is a limit of six (6) poultry entries. A production trio counts as one (1) entry.
