**ENROLLMENT INFORMATION**—The error in 4-Honline is still occurring. Please wait to enroll youth. An email will be sent, along with a post on Facebook when the issue is resolved. Adults may enroll, the issue is with youth enrollment payments. We ask that all members (including Clover Kids) and volunteers enroll on or before Feb. 1, but that will be a soft deadline in 2021. **VOLUNTEER SCREENING**—Nebraska Extension asks all volunteers to be screened through the Department of Health and Human Services for child abuse and neglect. Volunteers are screened in order to ensure a safe, positive, and nurturing environment for all youth involved with Nebraska 4-H programs and provide protection for the child, volunteer, educator, 4-H Council, Extension Board, and Nebraska Extension. All new volunteers and those that did not complete the screening process last year must be screened this year. It continues to be an online process, volunteers will go directly to a Department of Health and Human Services website, and there is a \$5.00 fee that will be paid online during the screening process.

### MARKET BEEF



\* **All 4-H Market Beef** must be weighed and tagged to be eligible for the County Fair Rate-of-Gain Contest. Plan to attend the Wayne County Weigh-in on February 28, 1:00-2:30 p.m. at the Wayne Veterinary Clinic. Masks are required.

\*DNA samples must be collected on animals exhibited at **Aksarben & State Fair**. In addition, beef must be tagged with an EID tag. Tags will be available at weigh-in. All animals weighed and tagged are eligible for the Norfolk Beef Expo Show and Sale.

\*The charge for each DNA sample is \$7.00. EID tags are \$3.00/tag. County only animal ear tags are \$1.00 each. **Tags must be paid for at weigh-in. DNA sample fees are paid online when inputting information into Show Stock Manager.**

\*Please be prepared to complete **all** paperwork. You will need to know which animals are home raised, county raised, and those returning from the 2020 County Fair.

\* In case of inclement weather listen to KTCH FM 104.9/AM 1590 or US92 92.7 FM. We will also post on the office Facebook page. The snow date is March 7, same location and time.

\***Please call the office before 5 p.m. on Friday, Feb. 26 if you cannot attend!** Market Beef not weighed at this time are ineligible for the County Rate-of-Gain Contest, but may be tagged and DNA pulled at home. Ear tags and DNA envelopes may be picked up at the Extension Office.



### COMPANION ANIMALS

\*The **Companion Animal Webinar Series** is a great way for 4-H leaders, parents, and senior aged youth to gain knowledge in various companion animal-related topic areas. A new topic will be covered in each session with various experts joining to share their experience and expertise. The webinars are hosted live online using Zoom on the first Thursday of each month at 6:00 PM CT. The next webinar is Feb. 4 and will be recorded for later viewing if you can't participate live.

\***Changes for the Horse Program:** You are welcome to watch a recorded webinar that explains all the changes. It is available at [4h.unl.edu/state-horse-expo-show](http://4h.unl.edu/state-horse-expo-show). Click *Changes (2021)* under Resources. The State 4-H Horse Show Schedule is available in the same location. In summary:

1) Advancement Level and Horse Rule Books are being updated and should be available in mid February.

\*Advancement Level 3—youth can now do a simple **or** flying lead change on the riding test

2) 2021 District & State 4-H Horse Shows

\*State Horse Show Schedule changes—schedule has moved up one day. Check-in will begin on Saturday, July 10. In-hand and trail classes held on Sunday, Pleasure and Horsemanship moved to Monday, etc.

\*Elementary age group added to speed events (one run only-no finals).

\*Ranch Pleasure—New class added to District Horse Show. It's a Level 2 rail class geared towards ranch type horses.

\*11 and over halter mare and halter gelding classes have been added to the State Horse Show

\*Reining—changed to a Level 3 class and only offered at the State Horse Show.

3) A roping competition is being planned for this fall in Lincoln. The UNL Rodeo team will be running the event. Goat tying (Level 2 class) has been added.

\***County Fair:** County Fair Horse ID's are due **June 15**. 4-Hers have until **June 15** to pass Horse Level 1, but all other levels must be passed by May 7 to count for classes entered in 2021.

The 2021 Special Garden Project is focused on the tasty **Hakurei Turnip**. These are not your grandmother's turnips. Hakurei is a white salad turnip that is smooth, round and at its best when harvested under 2". The roots can be eaten raw or cooked and the tops can also be cooked. 4-Hers enrolled in the project will receive a packet of seeds, a newsletter, and are eligible to exhibit at the County and State Fairs. ## 2021 SPECIAL AGRONOMY PROJECT-TEOSINTE

The Nebraska Extension Special Agronomy Project gives 4-H members an opportunity to experience a crop that is grown, was grown or has the potential to be grown in Nebraska. Youth participate by receiving seed and resources to grow the crop, research traits of the crop and determine the viability of that crop in the part of the state they live. The project allows 4-H members interested in agronomy to grow something fun, new, and different.

To kick-off the inaugural year of the special agronomy project, youth will explore teosinte. The plant looks and is very similar to corn, in fact it is believed to be the wild ancestor of today's corn!

Enroll for the 2021 Special Agronomy Project by enrolling in any of the Field Crop Project levels through 4-HOnline. Contact the Extension Office and let us know how many seed packets you need by **Feb. 12**. Seeds will be ordered for those who contact the office. Participants will be contacted when the seeds are available.

## INNOVATIVE YOUTH CORN CHALLENGE 2.0

Nebraska Extension and the Nebraska Corn Board are approaching the tenth-year of offering the Innovative Youth Corn Challenge contest. This contest, open to 4-H members (age 10 & older as of Dec. 31) or FFA members (in-school members), guides participants through all aspects of corn production, as well as agricultural careers related to corn production.



Prizes for participation in this project include 1st place - \$1,000, 2nd place - \$500, 3rd place - \$250, "Extra Mile" Award \$200, CORN Communications Award \$200 and \$50 for completion of the project. In addition, each team receives a crop scouting kit valued at over \$200, plot sign and the opportunity to engage with UNL agronomic professionals through "ask an agronomist" sessions.
