WAYNE COUNTY 4-H June 15th Checklist: Have you... 1. Enrolled in 4-H and checked your projects? Go to https://v2.4honline.com - youth must be enrolled to be eligible to exhibit at the County and State Fair. Project additions may be added until midnight June 15. 2. Completed Horse Advancement Level Testing for County Fair? Please contact the Extension Office to schedule the written test. 3. Completed YOCA? All 4-Hers enrolled in the breeding and market beef; bucket calf; feeder calf; cow/calf; dairy cattle; breeding meat, market, dairy, and pygmy goats; breeding and market sheep, swine, rabbit, and poultry projects are required to complete the Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) course. The online course can be found at https://yqcaprogram.org/ Instructions are available on the website under Youth and Parents | Web-based Training Help Document. All individuals that complete the web-based option, test-out option, or attend a Face-to-Face training other than those held in Wayne or Pierce will need to go back into their https://yqcaprogram.org account to download their certificate. Either email or print it off and bring it to the Extension Office. 4-HOnline and the YQCA site do not communicate. 4. Turned in your ID Forms? All County Fair ID Forms (Affidavits) for Breeding and Market Beef, Bucket Calf, Feeder Calf, Cow/Calf Pairs, Dairy Cattle; Breeding Meat, Market, Dairy, and Pygmy Goats; Horse, Breeding and Market Sheep, Rabbits, and Swine are due. It is your responsibility to make sure these forms are accurate. All necessary data must be present and correct. Can email, drop off using the drop box, or bring to the office. All ID papers are available for download at https://wayne.unl.edu/4hanimalaffidavits and at the Extension Office. 5. Completed Online Nominations for State Fair? Instructions for nominating State Fair Livestock are available at https://wayne.unl.edu/4-h- animal-information Made nominations at: https://showstockmgr.com and brought your DNA envelopes for State Fair for all Market and Breeding Livestock and Feeder Calves to the Extension Office? July 6th Deadline:

Entry information for Contest Day, County Fair, Bonus Auction, letting us know how many animals you are bringing to the Fair, Food Stand Schedule, and the 4-H/FFA section of the Fair Book will be mailed in big yellow envelopes to 4-H Families. Please note this is different from signing up for projects in 4-HOnline that is due on June 15. You are now making entries for what will be brought to the County Fair.

- **New for 2023:** Each 4-H/FFA animal exhibitor will indicate the number of animal(s) to be exhibited in 4-H/FFA and to sign up for the Bonus Auction in ShoWorks.

The following are due to the Extension Office. You may bring them to the office, put them in the drop box on the north side of the courthouse, or email to wayne-county@unl.edu:

- Exhibiting a Bucket Calf? Complete as much of the Bucket Calf Record as you can and include a picture if possible. The records will be returned at the Bucket Calf Show.
- Exhibiting a Cat, Dog, or Ferret? Proof of current vaccinations are due to our office.

 - \$15 Challenge Record
- Favorite Foods Contest call the Extension Office to enter
- Does your club want to have a Theme Booth? Organizational Leaders can call the Extension Office to sign up.

All information due by 5 PM, July 6. The websites will be shut down and the drop box checked at 5 PM. Timestamps checked on emails. Information received after this time will be subject to the 4-H Policy regarding missed deadlines:

The 4-H Youth Development Program strives to instill responsibility in all 4-H members. Part of the responsibility is making sure that all 4-H deadlines are followed. It is the 4-H Council's role to be consistent and fair to all 4-Hers. Therefore, if a 4-Her contacts the Nebraska Extension Office after a missed county deadline, the 4-Her will be allowed to participate in county events, contests, etc., but will be ineligible for trophies and advancement to the State Fair. In the case where ID papers are late, we must follow the state deadline so opportunities to participate in events beyond the county are out the 4-H Council's control.

explore food safety.


